#### Around the lodge

The BBQ is the main source of income for the Lodge. It pays the bills and keeps the lights on. We use Oaks to light the flames and give us an edge to our competitors. When a Thousand Oaks resident needs to remove a damaged, old, or dead Oak tree they need a permit from the city to have the tree removed or cut down. When this happens, "What do I do with all this wood?" The city advises them to call the Elks. Now cutting and splitting this wood is not done by osmosis, it is done by Elk members. It is a job that is crucial to the needs of the BBO. We have a wood lot. We don't sell the wood, we cut, split, stack then wait for Mother Nature to Cure the wood to get it ready to burn. Greg Sweet has taken over the chairmanship of the wood lot so if you would like to help with the wood lot, I know he'd be happy to have you.

Another aspect to getting involved, the Lodge has a multipurpose room which means just what says. It's our Lodge meeting room, Friday Night dining room, awards night room and the occasional rental for a birthday, wedding, or anything you can imagine. We have a crew of guys who comes out early in the morning to arrange the room for the upcoming event, then back again to set up for the meeting or dinner or whatever is on the agenda. **Bill Joseph** is chairing the set-up crew. We need help with this. Seems the men and women moving furniture are also the ones cutting wood and working the BBQ. We have 416 members, and we need your help. You don't need to be here every day but find something to get involved with.






Lowering of the flag at the time the first plane hit the North Tower









## Ceremony at the Lodge We Shall Never Forget







On the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of 9/11, the Thousand Oaks Elks Lodge #2477 paid their respects honoring the loss of Americans on September 11, 2001. At the time the first plane crashed into the North Tower, the Lodge raised the flag outside the Lodge, then lowered it to half-staff. Later in that day at 3PM the Lodge held a ceremony as not to forget.

The Ceremony was led by Exalted Ruler Richard Platt; assisted by Terry Gicking, Leading Knight; John Betancourt, Loyal Knight; and Trustee Chairman Dan Hoffman. The following was said:

"Good afternoon, welcome to the Thousand Oaks Elks Lodge # 2477. My name is Richard Platt, I am the Exalter Ruler of the Lodge, today I am joined by our Lodge's Chaplain, and Lodge Officers. We are here today to honor, all who were struck down, September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001, and subsequent actions. Please stand, if you can, our Chaplain will lead us in prayer."

"Almighty God, unto thy love and mercy we remember the many souls lost twenty years ago, on September 11, 2001. May light perpetual shine upon them till the mourning breaks and the shadows flee away. May we realize that we are thy children... and may we so live, that when our day is done, we may face the eternal change that comes to us in faith and confidence through thy redeeming grace and power. May the peace of the God which passes' all understanding abide with us forevermore...Ahmen."

"Twenty years ago, September 11, 2001, we the people, our lifestyle as well as the Government of the United States were suddenly and dastardly attacked by a coordinated group of nineteen radical al-Qaeda terrorists. The extremists seized control of American Airlines Flight #11, with 87 souls aboard, that was flown into the North Tower of the World Trade Center. United Flight #175, with 59 souls onboard, was flown into the South Tower, a few minutes later. On that day, working within the WTC were 2,676 souls, sadly all were lost, when both towers collapsed. The American citizens onboard those aircraft, as well as those working within the WTC, only sin was travelling aboard those particular flights or simply working in the WTC."

"345 NYFD, and 99 NYPD members, rushing to save all they could at the WTC collapse, also were killed. And yet al-Qaeda was not finished. American Airlines Flight #77, with 59 souls aboard, was flown into the Pentagon, killing an additional 126 innocent souls. United Flight #93, with 40 souls aboard, was destined to be flown into the US Capitol Building. When advised of

the other three attacks, the patriots aboard Flight #93 decided to fight for themselves, and our way of life and caused their plane to crash into a field near Shanksville, Pennsylvania. To date an additional 500 citizens and 190 members of the US Armed Forces, have died of injuries. sustained during the attacks. There are still well over 1000 souls reported as missing, from the WTC, whose remains have not been identified as of today. This was the largest single loss of life, to rescue personnel, in US history."

"Today the 9/11 Memorial and Museum sits where so many were lost. Included within the Memorial, are 6 innocent souls, lost during the bombing of the WTC, earlier in 1993. The Memorial Section pays honor to those who will come no more, and the Museum Section holds exhibits and artifacts from that terrible day. This attack marked a departure from the tactics used by al-Qaeda, in prior attacks. Now nearly all extremists' groups target, first responders in conjunction with other targets, of opportunity. "

"The attacks of September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001, triggered the most expensive, add the lengthiest combat, in our country's history. Thousands of young men and women died in that combat, along with the many now permanently injured, defending you and me. We today honor, every single one of the numerous Americans, who so bravely answered, their call to arms, in defense of our Country and our way of life."

Several members spoke of that day and what it meant.

"In vain we call, for those who have passed into the light, which is beyond the valley of the shadow of death. The places that have known them, shall know them no more, but their virtues are written upon the tablets of love and memory. We shall never forget September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001. Much of the information for this service, was obtained from the September Issue of the Elks Magazine and other public information sources."

"Join us after this observance, for some wonderful BBQ. We are asking for a five-dollar donation, that will be used to offset the cost of our upcoming Fire & Police Appreciation Dinner. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, a dinner we have not been able to hold for two years. This concludes our service, on behalf of the Order and the Thousand Oaks Elks Lodge # 2477, we thank you and please *never forget*."

The ceremony concluded with an outstanding BBQ late lunch, early dinner.
