Every State Association has a Major Project. California-Hawaii State Association started back in 1950, "the California-Hawaii Elks Major **Project**" where our State Trustees watch over a therapy program for kids 6 months to 18 years of age who can receive much needed physical, occupational, speech-language pathologists, for children whose parents who may not have access or if none is available. Maybe in between jobs and lost their coverage. We also supply preschool vision screeners to hopefully catch an early detection of lazy eye and other early childhood eye problems. Now our therapists make house calls. We go to the home weekly, work with the kids, work with the parents so that they may continue therapy in between visits of our professional therapist. Our therapists are rewarded by working for us. many have been with CHEMPI for 30 years+. We furnish their car, gas, insurance, and further training. It's a 4million-dollar a year budget and is only funded by every Lodge in California and Hawaii and its members. We thank the recurring donors they don't even think about it. Every month their donation goes in automatically, and Fresno keeps a tally and when a century club or millennium is made you receive a certificate and pin. Minimum recurring sign up is \$5 monthly, the most is left to your imagination. **CHEMPI** is a 501c (3) tax deductible donation.

Platt Potato Salad Recipe

Ingredients: Red Potatoes, Green Onions, Celery, Eggs, Mayonnaise, Spanish Smoked Paprika, and Parsley Flakes.

Costs and Managing Business by Richard Platt

The Lodge bar is currently open seven days a week. Presently bar sales on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday are roughly \$150.00 per day. We are not losing money at this point but are not going to make our projected yearly income. Like most things we buy, the cost of majority of the stock items we purchase are going up. The easy answers are either to buy less stock or look to increase prices. Then again, we are asking you to come in more often. Increased bar sales represent a positive influence on profitably.

That same economic cycle, increased cost of goods sold & decreased profitably, is impacting our BBQ, the economic lifeblood of the Lodge. I have talked with the BBQ Chief as well as the Crew Chiefs, and many of the crew members. Several members have nearly two decades of Saturday BBQing.

Gross BBQ sales numbers are up, but our cost of goods, stuff we buy to then sell retail is up, our percentage of profit (actual money made) is down. Again, it is that projected income trouble. Come to a House Meeting to learn more. That way Wednesday's bar sales will be up, which will help, and you will hear the entire conversations and outcome to these and many more issues. Supporting your Lodge is good business.
