

NEW FACILITIES Greg Metzgus, PER

Some of our members have noticed the paint marks on the curb and sidewalk along Conejo School Road and Los Feliz. These marks were placed by the Civil Engineer to gather information for a cross section sheet establishing curb elevations and drainage of our building site. The surveyors are working now on finding our property lines. Over the years these lines have become obscure and need to be defined before we start grading.

Our bid set of plans are still being developed and hopefully will be complete by my next writing. There is a lot of work required by several professions to put together an accurate set of building plans. Once we have this bid set we will be able to send it out to several contractors for pricing.

By now every member should have received a letter explaining our lodge's debenture bonds to finance this project. Please consider purchasing these bonds to lessen the burden placed upon us by using outside financing. We do have a commitment from a commercial lender but that loan comes with a lot of costs we would rather not incur. It would be to our advantage to put more money into our new building and less money into a commercial lender's pockets. The cost of borrowing from a bank would more than pay for our new kitchen, including the walk in refrigerator/ freezer. This, along with an attractive 6 ½% interest rate should be incentive for each member to help this project along by purchasing bonds.

The other thing our members can be doing now to help our building project is to increase our membership. When you look at all of the charity work our lodge does along with the opportunity to meet and socialize with some of the best people in our community, it is difficult to imagine anyone that would not like to be an Elk. We have lost some members because of our increase in dues. These losses need to be offset by bringing in new quality members to replace them. We know that our membership will increase when we start building but in the mean time, reach out and invite someone to become a member.

Our Exalted Ruler has scheduled building updates every month so please check the calendar and plan on attending. As we move into the next phase of our project

our member's input will be very important. The updated floor plan is available for review at these meetings and changes are easy to make on paper. Once building has began, changes become very expensive.

Thanks everyone for your support. This is the second largest step our lodge has ever taken, the first being taken by our founding brothers. The charter members of this lodge had the foresight to take the first step. Please do what you can as a member to take the next step, a new facility that reflects the charity and community spirit of our members




Hi Folks,

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY **Bob Savnav**

ARREARS CLASSIFI-**CATION**

For 138 years our laws have required that all members must pay their Lodge dues IN AD-VANCE, yet some Lodges are still confused over the method of determining who is in arrears and for how much. Since members are allowed to pay half-year dues, arrears are calculated in six-month increments. If a member has not paid the dues for the first half of the current year as of April 1, he is immediately six months in arrears. If he still has not paid anything when October 1 rolls around, he then becomes 1 vear in arrears (ves, even though one year in real time has not elasped). This obligation on the member to pay on time is not relieved regardless of whether he is sent dues notices or not. Also, a member can be dropped at any point after becoming one year in arrears, from October 2nd on to March 31st, when it (dropping him) becomes MANDATORY by our laws. It's all in the books (Secs. 14.160 & 14.300).
