

I will start this months Lecturing Knight article by sharing a discussion I had recently with a fellow Elk from our lodge. We were discussing the letter you all received concerning relocation of our lodge and specifically putting it up for sale. The comment was made that this particular member hoped that there would be no "secret meetings" like there were last year when we were trying to build a new lodge on our present site. I was taken aback because in all of the years I have been a member of our lodge, 5 of those as an officer, I have never attended a "secret meeting". I have attended closed meetings but only when they were to discuss disciplining a member or standing relief for a member and Grand Lodge dictates that those meetings are to be closed, not secret.

I was not in a position to discuss this issue with the member at the time but after thinking about it, I tried to remember the last time I saw this member in the lodge at a regular meeting. I couldn't. I then realized that this particular member was relying on information he received second hand and probably information passed around the lounge. I don't know if all of you are aware of this or not but, information passed around the lounge and bar area is not always 100% accurate.

Where then is a member to get up to date accurate information on what is happening with issues such as the proposed relocation of our lodge? At a regularly scheduled meeting; we have them on the first four Wednesdays of every month. At these meetings our various committees make reports. There is also a time set aside during the meeting for members to ask questions. We cannot afford to send out weekly or daily information about affairs of our lodge. You, as a member, have to put forth a little effort to keep informed. To keep up to date, you have to attend regularly scheduled meetings. If you miss a meeting, we have a portion of the meeting set aside to read the minutes of the previous session. If you miss several meetings, the minutes are available in the lodge office.

To summarize, attend the regularly scheduled meetings and you will be kept up to date. If you rely on second hand information or lounge gossip, you will no doubt be misinformed most, if not all of the time.

Please remember, our Army of Hope cans are placed in our lounge and at several businesses around town. The proceeds from this donation are being used to help our veterans returning from Afghanistan and Iraq. The Vietnam Veteran's Association has partnered with the Elks in this effort. Donna Hardy was more than just the Elks' bookkeeper. Wife, mother, grandmother, great grandmother, friend, camper, Elks Lady and much, much more, Donna led a rich and fulfilled life. As a Charter Member of the Elks Ladies and the group's Treasurer for many years, every lady in the group had an opportunity to meet Donna at some point. All of us are deeply sorrowful at this time of her passing.

Despite losing her beloved Bob a few years back, Donna carried on and took care of the business of living both personally and professionally. She never stopped being "Donna" even when life dealt her lemons. Many will recall the breakfast held in Donna's honor last August, after her illness forced her to give up working in the Elk's office. She told us at that time she had been feeling so poorly that she doubted she would even be able to attend the breakfast. She pointed out that all of our prayers and good thoughts had worked because upon waking up on Sunday, she felt marvelous. Donna was a spiritual person.

Sally Claunch recalls that prior to her going through the chairs for the Elks, Bob Hardy was her mentor to help prepare her. Sally chuckled as she told me that the best information came from Donna who knew everything there was to know about this lodge. 
