Hello everyone. Let me begin by congratulating Eddie Rice on the successful chili cook-off and Conejo Valley Days events. He spearheaded a series of events unprecedented in years gone by. He led a cadre of volunteers who provided an outstanding service to the CVD attendees and represented our Lodge to the community with pride and honor.

I want to also congratulate Kira Wagner, your Loyal Knight, Grant Thistle, your Lodge Esquire, and Rick Eddy, your Chaplin on their performances during Ritual Competition hosted by your lodge at the Westlake Hyatt hotel. Each received third place awards in their category.

Providing a service to our public within the Thousand Oaks community is something we do with devotion to our fellow Americans and neighbors. The way we go about performing these functions is something we must do in conformity with the Constitution of our Order and Grand Lodge Statutes. I would like to take this opportunity to refresh your memory as to the Constitution and statutes that pertain to the way we perform our functions as members of Thousand Oaks Lodge number 2477.

Grand Lodge Constitution and Statute References Concerning Handling of Funds Derived from Breakfasts, Dinners and Other Events

Opinion 7 under Article 3, Section 18 of the Constitution of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks reads:

An Elks Glee Club, recreational vehicle club, motorcycle club or like entity can only function under a committee appointed and controlled by the Lodge. All members must be Elks and *all receipts be for the benefit of the Lodge and be turned over to the Lodge treasurer*. (underlined and italicized by me).

Section 12.060 Opinion 2 of Grand Lodge Statutes reads:

Funds derived from dining room, bar and other services are Lodge funds (underlined and italicized by me). The Lodge Treasurer is Treasurer for all committees, and shall handle all Lodge funds and pay all bills on vouchers approved by the Exalted Ruler and the Secretary.

Lastly, let me remind you of a couple of other commitments made by yours truly. My oath of office as your Exalted Ruler:

"In the presence of God and this Lodge of Elks, I solemnly promise and swear to conform with and maintain the Constitution, Statues, Rules and Regulations of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and the By-Law of Thousand Oaks

What Technology Means for the Lodge.

For years, Elks have stayed connected through thick and thin using the telephone and the monthly publication (Anter Antics). These both are technical forms of communication I'm sure everyone has embraced.

Our society's technology is evolving at exponential speed. Computers themselves are evolving so quickly that by 2020 a single computer will be in our price range that will have as much information on it as you and I have in our noodles now (Google the words "the singularity").

So what does that mean for our lodge?

It means that, as a group, if we harness the technology that is so rapidly evolving here and now, we can avoid the miscommunications and manual efforts that plague us now and drag us into scraping the soil for our progress. Yes, this is where technology is now. I don't prefer a horse and buggy, do you?

Here's a real example: Kira just called me to say she left a schedule on the printer. I took a camera shot of it from my IPhone and text-messaged the picture to her phone—it took less than a minute total. Can you think of any way faster to get a communication job done?

So, I propose, then, that we, as a lodge, embrace technology and incorporate it when it makes sense and use what we can of it to help us make Lodge #2477 more attractive to

Idaho Potatoes Hashed In Cream

4 large potatoes

4 oz butter

1 qt. half'n'half (or all cream)

1/2 cup toasted bread crumbs salt & white pepper to taste preheat oven to 360 degrees



peel and cut the potatoes in matchstick size (1/8" x 1/8" x 2-3") (use a cuisinart with a 3mm x 3mm julienne blade) butter a 8" x 8" baking dish - place a layer of potatoes in the pan season with salt and pepper - dot with additional butter continue to layer the potatoes, etc. until the pan is full pour the cream over the potatoes to cover spread the bread crumbs on top and dot with additional butter bake in oven approximately 1 1/2 hours or until all cream is absorbed and top is golden brown Serves 6-8 hungry kampers

- *June 15th 1945- U.S. troops make an amphibious assault on the *Japanese held island od Saipan in the Marianas.
- *June 18th 1940- The USSR invades the Baltic states. 1942 The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers initiates the Manhattan Project to develop an atomic bomb.
