Tom S. Brazier was initiated into Santa Cruz, California Lodge No. 824 in 1989 and within a few days, took the position of Lodge Esquire, progressing through the chairs rapidly and serving as Exalted Ruler in 1993–1994. He served as a Lodge Trustee from 1994–1997, as Lodge and District Government Relations Chairman for two years, and as President of the Past Exalted Rulers Association for his West Central District. He chaired several charitable committees in the Lodge and founded the Christmas Charity Community Project in 1994. He was elected to honorary life membership.

He served the California-Hawaii Elks Association as Government Relations Chairman for two years, was a frequent lecturer and teacher at conventions, and was elected Honorary Past President of the California-Hawaii Elks Association.

He served the Grand Lodge as District Deputy in 2002–2003 and as Special Representative to troubled Local Lodges for several years. He served on the Grand Lodge Government Relations Committee for four years, as a member of the Grand Lodge Judiciary for five years, the last year as Chairman, and the Pardons Commission for one year. He also served as a Justice of the Grand Forum.

He graduated from Long Beach State College in 1965 with a degree in microbiology, completed an internship in laboratory medicine at the Long Beach Veterans Hospital, became a registered medical laboratory technologist, and spent many years working in and running medical laboratories in hospitals. He attended Loyola Law School in Los Angeles from 1969–1972, began medical malpractice defense work in litigated matters in 1972, and was an employee and a partner in several firms, starting his own practice in San Jose, California, in 1993. He practices in state and federal courts as a trial lawyer. He is admitted to the State Bar of California, to the Federal District Courts in California and is also admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court. Robert (Bob) Schrum was born in Modesto, California on April 25, 1940. While growing up, Bob lived in California, Oregon, Nevada, and Utah. Bob arrived on the Central Coast in 1952 and attended school in Cayucos and Cambria. Bob graduated from high school in Modesto, California in 1958.

Bob served in the Air Force for 26 years, retiring in 1985 in the grade of Chief Master Sergeant. During Bob's military career he served 18 years in the Security Service (now AF Intelligence, Reconnaissance and Surveillance Agency) and eight years in Missile Maintenance in the Strategic Air Command. While in the Security Service Bob flew 127 combat missions in Vietnam logging 683 hours in an EC-47 and 229 combat missions in a RC-130A logging 2,065 hours in Europe and the Mediterranean, earning 14 Air Medals. Bob was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for action during a classified mission in South Vietnam on March 18, 1968

After retiring from the military at Vandenberg AFB, Bob worked for Lockheed Space Operations Corporation on the Shuttle program

as a systems analyst in Engineering. After the Challenger crashed, Bob went to work in various Engineering jobs for Northrop and MCA Engineering, retiring in October 2010 as Manager of Engineering at Spaceport Systems International on Vandenberg AFB.

Bob was initiated into the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks in Lompoc Lodge #2274 on 25 March 1997. Bob was installed as Inner Guard in 1999 and worked his way through the chairs becoming Exalted Ruler 2002-2003. Bob served again as Exalted Ruler 2006-2007. As a PER, Bob served as District Chairman for Business Practices 2007-2009, Ritual Chairman 2009 and National Veterans Service Chairman 2009-2012. Bob has a Bachelor of Science in Business Management, a Mastersn Information Management and a Certificate of Engineering.

Bob resides in Lompoc with his wife Gisela. They have two daughters: Erica Jackson, now residing in Darmstadt Germany and Renate Peterson, now residing in Visalia California. have nine Grandchildren and four Great Grandchildren

MILITARY HISTORY

Earning a reputation for being one of the best pilots in the U.S. Army Air Force, Paul Tibbets was called on several times to serve as General Eisenhower's personal pilot. On August 6 1944 however, Tibbets was to fly a mission of a completely different sort. Despite being ravaged by Allied bombing runs and defeats across the Pacific, the Japanese refused to surrender. It appeared to U.S. commanders that an invasion of mainland Japan would be necessary-an operation that would ensure the deaths of many more Americans and Japanese. Instead, the deployment of the atomic bomb by Tibbet's Enola Gay on August 6Th and the second bomb on August 9Th. That second bomb being delivered on a plane named "Boxcar". This series of bombings convinced the Japanese to finally surrender on August 15, setting off huge celebrations in the States. The amount of dead was staggering but the Japanese would not give up till we showed them the fire power available from the United States. Many more soldiers would have died if the war was allowed to continue.

Purple Heart Day - August 7th

The Medal of Honor that is now the Purple Heart actually began as the 'Badge of Military Merit.' On August 7th, 1782 in Newburgh, New York, General George Washington designed a new badge of distinction for enlisted men and noncommissioned officers. They were awarded for 'any singularly meritorious action.' The badge was a figure of a heart in purple cloth or silk, edged with narrow lace or binding. It was pinned to a uniform coat above the left breast. That was then, this is now.



On January 7th of the year 1931, a new design was reopened. Ms. Elizabeth Will, an army heraldic specialist in the Office of the Quarter, created the design sketch for the present medal of the Purple Heart. It consists of a purple enameled heart within a bronze quarter inch border showing a relief profile of George Washington in continental uniform. Washington's family coat of arms adorns the medal, along with an inscription inside the heart that reads, 'For Military Merit.'

The Purple Heart is awarded to any member of the Armed Forces that has been wounded or killed, died as a result of a wound in battle, or otherwise designated by the President of the United States. This now includes those persons killed as a result of friendly fire. Now we celebrate Purple Heart Day on the anniversary of its inception, August 7th. On this day it is our patriotic duty to remember and recognize those people willing to serve our country, no matter the price.


