I'm thankful CHEA Association Vice President Robert M. Schrum chose to open the West Central Coast District Presidential Official Visitation of Art Echternacht and First Lady Shirley's dinner on August 4th at the Lompoc lodge with the POW/MIA Empty Chair Ceremony.

For those of you who were not able to be in attendance or who have never understood the significance of the table that so often times gets relocated or pushed aside in our own lodge room I'd like to explain the need to respect and honor its importance.

Those who have served and those currently serving in the uniformed services of the United States are ever mindful that the sweetness of enduring peace has always been tainted by the bitterness of personal sacrifice. We are compelled to never forget that while we enjoy our daily pleasures, there are others who have endured and may still be enduring the agonies of pain, deprivation, and internment. They're known as POW's and MIA's; more specifically they are men and women who are either Prisoners of War or Missing in Action! As of July 30, 2012 there are 83, 425 loved ones unaccounted for from current and past wars/conflicts. Brave men and women who through their own (and their families) willingness to serve us have given us our personal freedoms.

The following explains the meaning of each item on the table:

- *The table, set for one, is small, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner, alone against his or her suppressors.
- *The tablecloth is white, symbolic of the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms.
- *The single red rose in the vase, signifies the blood that many have shed in sacrifice to ensure the freedom of our beloved United States of America.
- *The rose also reminds us of the family and friends of our missing who keep the faith, while awaiting their return.
- *The yellow ribbon on the vase represents the yellow ribbons worn on the lapels of the thousands who demand with unyielding determination a proper accounting of our loved ones who are not among us tonight.

- *A slice of lemon on the plate reminds us of their bitter fate.
- *The salt sprinkled on the plate reminds us of the countless fallen tears of families as they continue to wait.
- *The American flag reminds us that many may never return and have paid the supreme sacrifice to insure our freedom.
- *The glass is inverted they cannot toast with us this night.
- *The chair is empty they are not here.
- *The candle is reminiscent of the light of hope which lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home, away from their captors, to the open arms of a grateful nation.

Now, please, be aware of this small empty table in our lodge room. Do not remember ghosts from the past, but remember 83, 425 loved ones who love life and freedom as we do. Let's honor and remember each one of them. It's befitting that we as Elks perform our eleven o'clock toast and now let's also keep true to our Pledge

"So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them." May we ever be mindful that the cost of our Freedom is Not Free!

Motion was made by PDDGER Greg Metzgus and 2ND by Loyal Knight JB Bre. Motion reads as follows: EXEMPLIFICATIONOFRITUALS

The officers of this lodge are authorized to use alternative forms of the opening, closing and initiatory rituals as approved by the grand lodge.

This will be an addition to our bylaws and will require a notice to the lodge for a vote in the future. At the first meeting in September we will vote by the members in attendance.

Also at the meeting of August 1st a motion was made to amend the By-Laws pertaining to the Tiler. At one time the Tiler was to remain out in the lounge to greet late arriving guests and members and escort them them to the Meeting room door. For not being allowed into the meeting it was decided to reimburse the Tiler's dues. Now that the Tiler is allowed to sit in the meeting room the reimbursement of dues is not needed. Motion reads as follows

For the faithful performance of his duties the Tiler shall receive as compensation for his services is a grateful membership. Motion made by David Naccarato Secretary.

Motion made at the General meeting of August 15th read:

The following Bylaw shall be adopted:

Prohibition Against Employing Members. Except as set forth below, the lodge shall not employ any member. This prohibition shall not preclude the employment of a member on a temporary basis (i) for a specific project, or(ii) when hiring someone other than a member is not reasonably practical in the judgement of the officers of the lodge.

The prohibition set forth above shall not preclude compensation of officers required under the Statutes of the Order or the Bylaws of the lodge.

Thus, the change to "Handicapped Children" and then to Disabled Children." If you were to write a check to CHEA for our Major Project, Please make it out to CHEA Major Project or just Major Project. Please don't make it out to Purple Pig. Checks made out to the BPOE 2477 with a notation at the bottom to Major Project will be accepted and credited to you on our books and put into our restricted line item. Hope this helps. 


