Terry Gicking was Santa (whoops the secrets out) and all had a good time. In addition we still held our meetings and our Friday night dinners, Monday and Tuesday meals, Saturday Bar B Q's. ### **MILITARY HISTORY**

#### ANZIO, January 1943

After an impressive beginning, pushing back German defenders in quick order, Allied ground forces have become stalled. At this point, it's hard to recall the optimism and the spectacular possibilities which looked so simple the day of the landing.

#### January 22 1944

In order to jump-start the attack, Allied troops have stormed ashore, initially taking the Nazis completely by surprise. Howerver, the battle-hardened German troops appear to have regrouped and are now responding in kind. But despite fierce shelling, British and American forces are holding firm and taking heavy toll in German casualties. (taken from original WWII field reports)



A monument in the truest sense, the Elks National Veterans Memorial was built in 1926 to honor Americans whose profound sacrifices for the nation can never be recognized by mere words. With its massive dome, heroic sculptures and intricately detailed friezes, the Memorial is a distinctively American interpretation of classical greatness.


