# A Message From The Secretary **David Naccarato**



WOW!!! What a month - gone for a week and when I returned you all seemed to go pretty easy on me as there were only 5 phone calls and a few pieces of mail. However, two days at Mid-Term Convention and it's late nights getting caught up on phone calls.

I think by now you've noticed I'm into the history of Elkdom, so while we were at Convention (one of the best I've attended) I

met the Association historian. He shared the Charter from New York Lodge #1, Philadelphia #2 and other Elk Playbills with our crest on it and he asked me if I noticed anything. There was a Moose representing the Elks! Let me explain. Back in the 1800's Moose, Deer, Elk were all the considered the same animal. Not until 1885 did they officially become their own species. So all artwork of early Elk lodges are shown with the Moose and once the Elk received notoriety they were all reprinted.

Overall the Mid-Term convention was very informative but one item was discussed over and over again; the \$28 Million judgment against a Pennsylvania Lodge (no longer in existence). During the sessions they explained exactly what happened and the long term ramifications. Remember, when you pay your dues it includes an assessment of \$22. Part of this goes to Grand Lodge and the State Association to cover our liability insurance. That lodge had to come up with \$1 million on its own but \$27 million was paid from our assessment. Result – the insurance company is raising our rates. Grand Lodge went looking for a new carrier however no one will touch us.

The impact this has had on our renovation has been ongoing. Brooke has done a fine job with signs directing members we were closed till Friday. E-mails and notices on our website went out that construction had started so please do not go into the Lodge so the workers can work and you're safe. New entrance signs are up to show members where to go for a libation and our lodge photographer has been taking pictures to share them with everyone. We even had to cancel some off-site events that our Trustees' had already counted because we could not get additional insurance.

The second part to this is the Grand Lodge assessment. Currently it is \$16. They have sold the Elks retirement and \$1 of the assessment went to the home so everyone thought the new assessment would revert back to \$15. However, with this \$28 Million judgment they have to raise the assessment \$1.50 to cover the new insurance premium. So now we're back to \$16.50. I'm just waiting for official notification from Grand Lodge that should confirm it will be effective April 1. The Association amount will stay the same at \$6 so the dues total will increase by \$.50.

On another happier note – a big shout-out to all of the BBQ volunteers and our lodge photographer for all they have been doing this past 6 weeks and remember - we really need your help with the Christmas Tree Lot and the Charity Baskets! Thank you in advance for all you do!





Although the Veterans Hero Awards dinner has been postponed due to the lounge renovation, it should be noted that David Stull is a US Army Hero. He was awarded the Army Commendation in 1968 for heroism against hostile insurgent forces in Vietnam protecting his men in a nightly ambush.

Lounge renovations are well underway, and despite a few left turns that were not anticipated, we remain on schedule and within December 11, 1941 – Germany & Italy declared war on U.S. budget with a goal of completion by Thanksgiving.

Your cooperation during this construction period is greatly appreciated and, with a very few exceptions, members have avoided the construction area. The limited access to the lounge is for the safety of members and is also intended to expedite completion of the project.

Remember that we are continuing to provide bar service. Hopefully, by the time this is published, the construction project will be nearing completion.
