# A Message From The Secretary David Naccarato



I've ran this before but from questions I've been getting it's time again. When we donate to the Major Project/ Purple Pig/ and CHEMPI they have different levels of participation. To receive a Century Club Certificate and pin it requires a single donation of \$100. Once Fresno receives it they will release the certificate and Fresno keeps track of the Century Clubs and releases a Millennium Certificate when you

reach \$1000. They also have a 52 Club for those who want to work up to \$52. The Century Club is a single donation of \$100. But because I'm a softy and send in the money to Fresno when our account reaches \$3,000 I go through all of the Purple Pig reports from the first general meetings of each month and add up your donations and when you have accumulated \$100 I send in your name. By doing this papers get lost and you know I can't add so some may think it's taking longer than what you might think it should, that's why CHEMPI only accepts \$100 donations so there will not be any confusion. Speaking of the Christmas tree lot we had many members down there braving the rain unloading the trees from Oregon. While they were unloading we were selling. The phone at the lodge was ablaze with calls from patrons that purchase their trees from us every year asking when we were going to open. I told them we are unloading as were speaking.

Looks like a good year. Alot of work but a nice income for the lodge in just 18 days. Thank you members of the tree lot. I've done it in the past, but just be in the way now. Thanks

Now this is interesting, In 1963 the call up of lodge was reduced from four raps to three raps, with three raps used previously as a signal to remove the blindfold. (removed in 1952)

In 1923 Green Bay lodge #259 held a fundraiser for newly formed Green Bay Packers.

On December 10th 1941, the Elks lost the Manila Lodge #761 to the Japanese invasion and then on January 4th 1942, the Agana, Guam, lodge #1281 was overrun; 489 Elk members and their families spent the remainder of the war in Japanese concentration camps.

On December 1st,1889, Allen O.Meyers, a member of Columbus lodge #37 in Ohio, named the first Sunday of December as our great Elk Memorial Day.

On September 30th,1908 PGER John K. Tener of the Charleroi Lodge umpired a spirited baseball game between Greensburg lodge #511 and the Boston Red Sox, led by Cy Young; The Elks won 2-0



It is the start of a new calendar year, and now is the time to make a personal resolution regarding your Lodge Membership situation. Resolve to call upon all Members to help improve Lodge membership numbers because membership is our number one issue. Resolve to work these final months of the Lodge year for a plus membership year in your

Lodge. Resolve to act now!

Lodge Secretaries and Exalted Rulers: Do not go it alone – ask for help from your key Members. Enlist the help of your Past Exalted Rulers Association. Additionally, you should engage the Proposers of delinquent Members to call on their initiates

All local delinquent Members should receive a personal visit from a key Lodge Member. This will enable Lodge officials to determine if the delinquent Member is sick or in distress and should be the subject of a review by the Lodge Standing Relief Committee. The pride of distressed Members will often prevent them from talking about their situation on the phone. You know the Grand Lodge and State Association dues and per capitas have already been paid by the Lodge, and if you allow the Member to be dropped from the rolls then you will have gained nothing this year.

Special consideration should be given to delinquent Members who have attained Life Member status. These Members have paid at least 30 years of dues and may be in a situation where family members are making financial decisions for the Member. It is a shame to coldly drop these long-standing Members who may well be incapable of making their own financial decisions. Again, face-to-face visits with a delinquent Member is imperative.

Form a committee to call upon Members who have been dropped from the rolls the past five years, and remind them of the good works your Lodge does in your community. Let's all pull together to get the Plus 1 status for the Lodge and for the Order.

# **Veterans - by Carl Lanterman**

On December 4th, the Cal Vet Home–Ventura celebrated its 5-year Founders Day. The event was hosted by Administrator Michelle Roulston with Master of Ceremonies Col. George J. Compton, U.S. Army, ret., and was attended by many who were involved with the original opening. Some attendees were Mayor Cheryl Heitmann of Ventura and representatives of Congresswoman Julia Brownley's office and Jackson's office as well as Ron Greenwood and JC Oberst of the Gold Coast Veterans Foundation. Ventura County's beloved Tuskegee Airman and wife, Madeline-volunteer extraordinaire-were also in attendance. Madeline is a recent recipient of a national American Legion Auxiliary award and RT is a past recipient of the Ventura County Stand Down Volunteer of the Year award, among other awards for both.

Besides Robert Jones bringing his karaoke system for monthly visits, the lodge also has provided a portable dance floor and member Bill Sternberg (also western region scouting chairman and lodge flag chairman) built an entertainment center and 3 large bulletin boards, still in use at the home. Annually, the residents are invited to attend a brunch and flag retirement at the lodge for Veterans Remembrance Month in November. Lodge members have provided thousands of dollars in donations of various types over the past five years.

On December 12th, Terry Gicking donned his Santa suit and made the children of military families happy at Operation Snowflake, put on by the Ventura County Military Collaborative. Sometimes, the call up of the National Guard and reservists poses particularly difficult situations with the families. Our lodge helps these families as part of the "Army-of-Hope" program established by the grand lodge, as implemented by our lodge.

The dinner for honoring our own veteran heroes in November was cancelled due to construction. Rescheduling has been difficult, but don't give up.

January 31st is expected to see our first community based veterans event with a BBQ at 4pm and informal gathering afterwards. Watch for fliers.
