


We moved back to California in the early fifties. We lived in Mar Vista and West Los Angeles. Dad worked in aerospace and mom had six more children. I had a normal

Jaws of Life Vehicle Extraction. I even took classes in teaching, and spent 11 years as our Fire Academy Flammable Liquid Fire Control Instructor and six years as the Fire Hose Operations Instructor. I also taught First Aid and CPR classes. I had 29 great years with the fire department before I had to retire.

And now after almost 16 years of retirement I am looking forward to seeing what is next.

Scouting Report

This comes from our Scouting Chairman Bill Miller. Melody Rafelson is the Chair for the 2016 Scouting for Food campaign in the Conejo District. Below is her description of this charitable scouting effort. Pictured are members and parents of Troop 754.

Scouting for Food is a national effort by the Boy Scouts of America. It is usually the 4th Saturday of February, so for this year the collection date was Saturday, February 27, 2016. The boys distribute fliers to doorsteps the week before asking that food items be placed in front of homes for pick up. I coordinated all of the Cub Scout Packs, Boy Scout Troops, Teams and Crews in the Conejo Valley as part of the food drive. We then have everybody bring their food to a central location to be

sorted.

We had 377 Scouts of all ages participate



in the Conejo Valley, we collected 22,000 items or over 18,000 pounds of food which

was donated to the Manna Food Pantry here in town. Each district in Ventura County donates to their own local food pantry – the Conejo District helps Manna each year.

Ann Church is our Scouting for Food coordinator for Troop 754. She does an amazing job each year making sure the boys know what neighborhoods they are collecting from and coordinating the flier drop off and food pick up. I am also a Troop mom — my son is a Scout in Troop 754. Our Troop collects from a lot of neighborhoods in Newbury Park. They always do an awesome job, I'm very proud to be a part of Troop 754.

Let me begin by wishing everyone a belated Happy Easter or Happy Spring whatever you subscribe to. They say it is the thought that counts and I'm feeling very festive and just back

from a wonderful cruise through the Panama Canal and several points south in Central and South America, which makes me happy. The weather has been warm this week and flowers are blooming everywhere. Now that kind of makes me angry as we cancelled our February campout anticipating an El Nino weekend. Can those meteorologists ever get it right?

So what shall I write about I wonder? What type of non-camping information might people like to read about? Got it! Crew Chiefs. What is a crew chief you ask? (I know you did, admit it). A crew chief is a coordinator for a breakfast crew. You remember, the campers serve breakfast for the AA meetings and the Elks twice a month - the first and last Sunday of the month. It is busy and a crew consists of about 10 people. Everyone

has their own job and I'll talk about that in a minute. There are a few details the crew chief handles before we even get to Sunday like making sure he/she has enough people. If not, they start asking friends to volunteer. Its not hard to work on a crew as you only have one job - you might make toast, or cook bacon/sausage, you could be the egg cracker or work the grill. These are just some of the duties of a crew member. I personally serve the plates of food to folks in the dining room. I get enough kitchen at home, so serving suits me fine. Many people work once a month, some twice a month and some occasionally as substitutes - your choice.

Back to the crew chief. At the moment we have only two crew chiefs and we are getting a new one soon. Cheryl has volunteered to be one too. But, we still need more. You can either get in the rotation or be a substitute or even try it once to see how you like it. We need more crew chiefs and you don't need to be a camper, though we love our campers, many of us are already on a crew and by becoming a crew chief, we would leave a vacancy on the crew. So, think about it and give it a try if this appeals to you.

We have a lot of fun on Sunday and all the crew members know their jobs so its not like training or babysitting is needed, just a little coordination which includes some shopping for items not stocked by the lodge and making sure the meat and potatoes get defrosted ahead of time. You don't have to mess with the money or the reports except to let Cheryl know how much in supplies we used after all the cooking is done.

To volunteer or to ask questions about being a crew chief, contact Jim Moye, Mike Flannery or me, Jessica Stull. Any of us are happy to answer questions or get you started.
