Lapsation Report

At the beginning of the 2016-2017 Elk year on April 1st, our lodge had a membership total of 433. Since that date we have initiated 21 new members, reinstated two and transferred in one. On the flip side we had two deaths and one member transferred out bringing our membership total to 454 for a net gain of 21.

We still have 25 members on the delinquency list. These are members who joined and decided being an Elk was not for them. Nonetheless, the lodge had to pay a \$22.00 assessment fee for each of them, totaling \$550. For the All American Lodge contest we receive points for less than 2% lapsation. Our lapsation rate is 5.77%, so no points here.

In September we investigated four candidates for initiation in October. Also

in September, 15 candidates attended orientation and we initiated 12. We also had three reinstatements bringing the membership total for September 30th to 469. We will look fairly decent for our District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler's visitation on October 26th.

Charles A. Vivian

When reading about the early times of the Elks, I find the story has changes from time to time. This one I will share with you.

On Friday, November 15, 1867, Charles Vivian, an English comic singer, landed in New York via an English trading vessel from South Hampton. The day he arrived he went into the Star Hotel, a free and easy place run by John Ireland. Richard Steirly, also English, was a piano player at the Star Hotel. Charles struck up a conversation and volunteered to sing a few songs. Charles made such an impression on John Ireland that he sent for his friend Robert Butler, a manager of the American Theater on Broadway. Vivian sang for Butler and making a great impression, received a three week engagement.

When closing time drew near, he took Charles to a boarding house. The street he lived on had a name change in 1939 by the city of New York, from Elm Street to Elk Street, to pay tribute to the famous order of Elks

Charles was introduced to other actors and singers and was shown a game with three wine corks.

Each player held a cork and when a fourth person said go, each contestant was to lift his cork. The last man to do so was to buy a round. The new contestant to the group had no idea he was being duped, for when the command of "Go" was given, the ones

in the know passed their hands over their cork while the newcomer was both first and last to pick it up and was stuck to buy a round.

Birth of the Jolly Corks

About this time in New York, Sunday was considered a "dry day". Those with the corks would meet at one of the homes of the entertainers. They had to move a lot for they were quite noisy. They did find a room over a saloon on Delancy Street and would save up libations during the week and on Sunday they had the only game in town. Their membership card was a cork.

A feud started between two factions within the ranks (they had problems back then too) with Charles Vivian going off on tour, still very much involved but never becoming an Elk himself.

Some wanted degrees of membership such as with the Masons and others did not. When the vote did not come in favor of Charles, he left New York. Charles moved and died of pneumonia in Leadville, Colorado on March 20, 1880.

On April 28, 1889, Boston Lodge #10 exhumed his remains and buried him in Boston at Mt. Hope Cemetery. Charles Vivian never said he was an Elk but that he was one of the organizers. He also wanted "Buffalo's" for our name. Please give me a break. Ever seen a buffalo? The Elk is strong of limb, fleet of foot, quick and keen of perception. So should we be, quick to hear the cry of distress, timorous of doing wrong and fleet of foot to relieve the unfortunate thus conforming to the Golden Rule which should govern all mankind. "The faults of our members we write upon the sand, their virtues upon the tablets of love and memory."

Elks National Veterans Services Commission

Elks hold Veterans in a high esteem. This was evident during the Grand Lodge session in Los Angeles in 1921. A proposal was made to establish the Elks Headquarters in Chicago. Also, the order was to erect a memorial building honoring those who served and gave their lives during the Great War. Elk lodges raised 2.5 million dollars to pay for the new building. The cornerstone was laid June 7, 1924. On June 14, 1926, the edifice was formally dedicated to those who served

in WWI. The building was rededicated in 1946 for those who saw service in WWII and again in 1976; this honor was bestowed on those who answered the call in Korea and Vietnam.

In 1990, Elks Lodges raised 4.5 million to refurbish the memorial and on July 3 1994, it was rededicated to peace and to those who served in Grenada, Panama, Operation Desert Storm and other conflicts.

At the convention in New Orleans in 1995, on July 13th, the name Elks National Service Commission was changed to Elks National Veterans Service Commission.

Our story is long, our work is humble, our history is proud. The Elks National Veterans Service Commission will continue serving our nation's veterans.


