

November is Veterans Remembrance Month

November of every year is designated Veterans Remembrance Month by the Elks. Our lodge holds a complimentary brunch for all Veterans.

Many Veteran heroes such as Audie Murphy, Eddie Rickenbacker, General John J. Pershing, John Bradley and Herbert Klein were Elks.

Other Veterans to remember are Captain Steve Richie of the 555th fighter squadron, who was the first USAF ace of the Vietnam War. On September 9th, 1972, Col. Charles De Bellevue, also with the 555th, took down two MiG 19's giving him his 5th and 6th victories and made him the highest scoring U.S. aviator during the Vietnam War. Charles McGee of the Tuskegee Airmen flew his P-51 "Kitten" to a record 408 combat missions during WWII. It is still an Air Force record. Major Richard Bong flew his P-38J "Marge" in WWII and downed over 40 Japanese aircraft.

We also honor Veterans closer to home

and members of our lodge:

- Major Herb Jellander who flew an F-8
 Crusader for the Marines off the decks
 of the Kitty Hawk, Forrestal, Midway
 and the Enterprise, sometimes in 60
 foot swells, to protect our ground
 forces.
- Another Marine, John Leadam, was first on the ground for fire direction in Inchon, Korea. He served 8 years.
- Army Ranger, paratrooper David Stull received the United States Commendation Medal and a Purple Heart for wounds received in Vietnam.

There are many other lodge members who also served our country. When we have our heroes' dinner early next year, please join us and show your support of our Veterans.

For veterans discharged prior to 1950, there is no DD214; it is called SEPARATION FROM THE U.S. ARMY,

NAVY, etc. Sometimes it is necessary to provide discharge papers and it makes life easier if you have them readily available. If you don't have them, call Art @ 805-241-5719 or call the Ventura County Veteran Services office at 805-477-5480. You can also go on line to www.archives.gov.

A free legal counseling service for veterans is available by the Ventura County Military Collaborative. See www.military411.org or call 805-419-3185.

Over the last two years our lodge has seen many new members. Many never heard how the lodge was started. I enjoy this story.

1971 - Our lodge started with a conversation between Dick Flake and Vern McNaboe. At the time, the West Central Coast District consisted of just 7 lodges and we now have 12. Dick, a member of Garden Grove, and Vern, a member of San Fernando, were having dinner at the Holiday Inn and the conversation soon turned to the subject of Elkdom. A man from CHEA named John Armstrong overheard their conversation. John was the New Lodge Development Chairman for CHEA.

John showed Dick and Vern the steps toward instituting a new lodge. With a list of stray Elks in our area, they sent out invitations to start a lodge in Thousand Oaks. Back then, Thousand Oaks was only 27,000 strong with two high schools, and Westlake Village was just a twinkle in

with this bunch it seems. People played cards, talked and just enjoyed themselves. Saturday morning we had our potluck brunch on the patio at the lodge. It is lovely with its umbrella tables and tile shelves and the weather was pleasant. Virginia and Joel won the free campouts and Mike Flannery won the 50/50. Jimmy Miller was our Sheriff, and partner. He did a mighty fine job!

While waiting for the main event at the lodge on Saturday - Blow Up Your Motor, people went about a variety of activities and some of us went to the Beachside Cafe down by the university. A microcosm of activity, people were surfing, sunbathing, jogging, walking dogs, eating, drinking, and so much more. It's fun just peoplewatching there. The ocean was so lovely we took some photos on the sand and on the pier (check the website, they should be there).

Blow Up Your Motor - Saturday evening the SB Elks Lodge was the scene of a fundraiser for scholarships. There were five vehicles of various vintage named after political figures such as the Hillary Hemi and the Donald. People bet on how long it would take each vehicle to blow up, as the water and oil had been drained from the cars. It was hilarious as the cars were equipped with surprises like airbags that blew off the hood or the trunk lid. The Mercedes had all four wheels blown off before it finally stopped running. They had massive raffle prizes, a band, bbg by the Elks and so much more. One small truck that was blown up belonged to the Santa Inez HS shop class. I think we all attended, though none of us won anything. September 4, the Kampers served 69 AA breakfasts and 38 Elks for a total of 107 breakfasts on a holiday weekend - GREAT JOB, and on September 25 we did 39 AA breakfasts and 25 Elks. Though the lowest Sunday in a long time, combined with the beginning of the month, still a respectable 107 breakfasts for September. Thanks to everyone who helped make this possible.

someone's eye.

The first meeting was held on the night of the great earthquake, February 16, 1971, so you can say we got off to a rocky start. Five employees of State Farm who had been Elks ("stray") became part of the team. To raise capital, each donated \$50, which went a long way in 1971, and they started meeting at DuPar's restaurant. Raffles were not allowed in the restaurant so they moved to a tack room in Lynn Ranch and among the hay and manure the Thousand Oaks Elks lodge was underway.

The Grand Lodge mandated that it would take 300 members to start a lodge. We had 252 but a dispensation was granted. In February, 1972, we were granted our charter (which the Simi Lodge has since stolen twice and held for ransom). On March 25th, in the gym at Thousand Oaks High School, we were instituted by the Oxnard Lodge. In March, 1973, all members were asked to come and vote on purchasing the former Lutheran Church at 158 Conejo School Rd.

Having no funds and needing \$85,000, the Officers and Trustees worked out a deal with a local bank, where one of our members worked, to obtain a loan. However, prior to obtaining the loan there was one caveat. Some of the lodge members needed to put their homes up as security against default of the loan. Robert Clark, Sr., Jack Henry, Dick Churik, Paul Jones, Dick Flake, Frank Rindone, John Farhat, Erle Pittman and Don Steinhelper did so under the name of "Conejo Brothers". Thanks to them also donating \$1,000 each personally, the purchase of the property was completed for a total price of \$97,000.
