

We had our District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler Visitation on the 26th of October. Robert Alvarez and his Auditor went through our books and were very impressed with David Pearson, our Accounting/

Auditing Chairman, who works regularly with accountant Cherri Peterson and our Chairman of the Board, Pam Price. They had never seen a cleaner set of books. Of course, Dave told them "when you have good people working the daily grind, it makes my job much easier and the lodge look good".

Jim Moye, as Exalted Ruler, wanted his legacy to be the paving of the parking lot. With the help of Trustee Darryl Kopacz and contributions from the PERs, Kampers and members, it became a reality. Groundskeeper Ben Reiger spoke with the men paving the lot and had a strip laid down for me so the wheels of my chair would not dig into the dirt. It's so much nicer. Thanks to you guys.

Now onto Elk stuff. In January, 1941, in ceremonies at the White House, President Roosevelt mentioned in his speech the works of the Elks in national defense. He himself belonged to Lodge 275 in Poughkeepsie, New York.

The Army Adjutant General asked the Order in 1942 to assist in recruiting 45,000 enlistees for Air Corps ground crews. The Order did 97,000. Frank Knox, Secretary of the Navy, wired the Elks for help with their Naval Air Corps program. Again, the subordinate lodges responded magnificently. The famous Seabees also asked for help and got all the recruits they needed. In the fall of 1943, the Army and Navy sent a special tribute to the Elks entitled "full credit for the success obtained."

From 18 months before Pearl Harbor to the surrender of Japan, the patriotism of the Order was once again indelibly proven.

A Day That Will Live in Infamy

December 7th, 1941 was a dark day in our nation's history. When Admiral Nimitz was ordered to take over the 7th fleet he arrived to find that the spirit of American servicemen was in despair, dejection and defeat. After a tour of the destruction he was asked, "What do you think?" Admiral Nimitz said we are very lucky that the Japanese made three major mistakes. The United States was helping our Allies in Europe. The Japanese thought, "Hey we can sneak in their back door and destroy their Naval fleet."

Their first mistake was the Japanese attacked on a Sunday. Nine out of ten crewmen were on shore leave. If those same ships were at sea in deep water we would have lost 38,000 men.

Second, when they saw all those battleships lined up in a row they got so carried away sinking our battleships, they never once bombed our dry docks opposite those ships or our submarine base on Quarry Point. Our sunken ships were in shallow water and could be raised and repaired in the same amount of time as

being towed to San Diego or Long Beach.

The third mistake was every drop of oil, four and one half million barrels, were in aboveground tanks. Underground facilities were in the process of being built but not in place as yet. A 50 cal. could have made quick work of them. In spite of what we suffered, the attack unified a country, which was not at all sure it wanted to get involved in WWII. The United States Navy was often compared to the Japanese as inferior. Where we showed strength with aircraft carriers the Japanese regarded the battleship as the cornerstone of force. The Japanese fleet can maintain 22 Knots to our 18 Knots. Their ships were massive compared to ours due to the fact ours had to travel through the Panama Canal. We had size restrictions, they did not.

So as you see the good Lord was looking out for us although it didn't seem like it at the time. As our money says, "IN GOD WE TRUST"


Little Known WWII Facts A Close Call

On December 6th, 1941, Pilot Earl Cooper and Navigator John "Davy" Crockett, along with their crew, flew their B-17C Flying Fortress to the Philippines by way of Oahu, Hawaii. But, arriving in Hawaii on the morning of December 7th, the unarmed B-17 met Japanese Zeroes. After evasive measures and the loss of one engine, they were forced to belly land at Wheeler Field, flying on fumes. All survived with minor injuries.

A Finishing Touch

On April 18th, 1943, the 339th Fighter Squadron flying P-38 Lightnings, under the command of Major John Mitchell, found themselves in the right place at the right time. They intercepted Admiral Isoroku Yamamoto, the mastermind behind the attack on Pearl Harbor. Rex T. Barber was the P-38 ace who shot down Yamamoto's Mitsubishi G4M.
