I've written in the past about how we received our name "Elk". Sure I said it was a vote between the buffalo and the elk and the vote came down to 8 to 7 in favor of the elk, but why an animal at all? When the drinking club, called the "Jolly Corks", started to grow, the members felt they needed a more dignified name along the lines of the Order of Buffaloes in England. So, looking for inspiration, the group took a stroll and wandered into Barnum's American Museum in New York

At the museum, they filed passed the taxidermy exhibits they considered one exhibit after another, and rejected one animal after another. The bears were too violent, the beavers were too destructive and foxes were too devious. Finally, they came upon a strong looking creature with proud spreading antlers, about whom no negative quality sprang to mind. When the idea was brought to a vote, on February 16,th 1868, the majority agreed. The erstwhile Jolly Corks would from then on be known as the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks.

February 4, 1945 - USO founded

What to do when a veteran passes away:

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) realizes the loss of a loved one is a difficult experience. VA has established a streamlined process for families, executors and legal representatives to follow to notify the VA about the death of a veteran enrolled in the VA health system.

Why should I notify the VA about the death of an enrolled veteran?

- Notifying the VA limits the chance for others to falsely use the veteran's identity.
- By updating the veteran's information, you will reduce the likelihood of the VA

continuing to send correspondence about VA benefits, services and bills.

• You will be helping the VA to maintain up-to-date records, which will enhance the agency's efforts to better distribute services to the veteran community.

Steps for notifying the VA are simple and easy to follow:

- 1. The next of kin and/or legally authorized representative under State law should otain an official copy of the veteran's death certificate.
- 2. Submit the death certificate to the Office of Decedent Affairs at the VA medical facility where the veteran was

receiving healthcare benefits or contact VA Health Resources Center at 1-877-222-VETS for additional instructions. (Above information issued by U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs)

If any veteran needs a VA card, please let me know and I can direct you where to go in Oxnard to obtain the card.
