Our lodge has its own story but the Elks originally started when Charles Vivian, a 25 year-old singer (a Tenor), arrived in New York from England on November 15th, 1867. He attained some measure of success as a variety performer. He also struck up a large and boisterous number of acquaintances in the performing world, the nucleus of what would become the Elks.

Vivian's friends were soon known as the Jolly Corks due to a cork trick that was

used to initiate new members into their group. At a meeting February 2nd, 1868, presided by Charles Vivian, a motion was made to organize the "Jolly Corks" as a lodge along benevolent and fraternal lines. The motion also provided for a committee to be appointed to formulate rules and regulations for its governance, prepare a suitable ritual and select a new name. With a proclamation from the state of New York the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks was formalized on February 16th, 1868. Why Elks is a whole other story and I'm already to long on words. However, I do want to say that on Christmas Day, 1867 one of the Corks had died and the others rallied around his wife and their children to providing funds needed to get back to on their feet. Not only did they meet for fellowship the Corks also had a noble purpose.


