Veterans Services

Dates to Remember (Taken from VFW Calendar)

The NSCC (Naval Sea Cadets Corps) was founded in 1958 by the Navy League of the United States at the request of the Department of the Navy. In 1962, the USNSCC was chartered under Title 36 of the United States Code as a non-profit youth organization with an emphasis towards the sea-going services of the United States. The law was amended in 1974 to allow female participation in the USNSCC.

Initially part of the United States Army, the USAF was formed as a separate branch of the military on September 18, 1947 under the National Security Act of 1947. It is the most recent branch of the U.S. military to be formed. The USAF is the largest and one of the most technologically advanced air forces in the world.

The VFW was reorganized in 1913 as the result of a series of mergers of previous veterans organizations which consisted of veterans of the Spanish–American War and the Philippine Insurrection. The VFW modeled its organization, terminology and ritual on the Grand Army of the Republic—an organization for veterans of

all ranks who had served in the American Civil War, but kept the "foreign" aspect of the organization, which excluded Civil War veterans.

The 25th annual Ventura County Stand Down was held on July 28-30, 2017 at the Army National Guard Armory in Ventura. As in years past, the participation of our lodge and of Elks around the county was terrific. Terry Gicking again organized the four VC lodges to provide sodas and Sunday bag lunches for more than 250 veterans and volunteers. Tom Hartin again got his team together to provide a great Mexican lunch. Carol Fredericks, in addition to providing most of the photos that are on the website gallery (vcstanddown.org) also assisted me in the personal welcome of the veterans as they came in on buses and vans that were provided, from West L.A. to Santa Barbara, as Gerry Gillies again provided transportation from Thousand Oaks. Steve Kerman also assisted with transportation and with twice baked potatoes, and Friday's Mexican lunch and anything else that was asked of him. When a "thank you" was offered to Steve, his response was "Thank you for the opportunity for

such a humbling experience."

It is estimated that about 25-30 Elks gave of their time over the weekend. Our lodge provided about 15 volunteers giving 60 hours, driving 840 miles, and \$600 cash and \$1,800 non-cash contributions.

As the honored recipient of the Annual Volunteer Award for the Stand Down, I want to say thank you to all the volunteers and other lodge supporters of our veterans programs! Among all the military, county, Elks, VFW and American Legion volunteers and others, this was an honor beyond imagination.





The trip to camp was a trip of a life time for this young man. The camp is Camp Buffalo Bill in Wyoming. They car pooled to camp, so this was a great road trip. Before camp they toured Yellowstone National Park.

Elks Trivia

At the last orientation, you don't always have candidates that know absolutely nothing about the Elks. In fact when our latest officers Paul Radomski (not Randomski) and Daniel Hoffman did all their research before joining the order. Anyway, to continue my story, one candidate spoke up asking about the blindfold. It caught me off guard that he would ask but he was totally correct. Back then were just 500 lodges. Just sayin', I don't know if I'd want to fly back in 1928. We'll have to check with our pilot members. Of course we did have train service. I love this stuff. OK I'm done.
