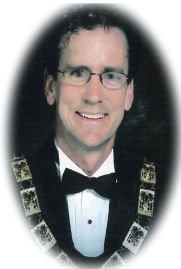

## Secretary David Naccarato



With dues notices going out and dues coming in, let me first say thank you for the extra 50 cents. It proves that you do read my Antler Antics article.

With the celebration of 46 years as a lodge and 150 years as an organization, I did some checking. In 1868, just three years after the civil war, they were not accepting checks. Master Card and Visa were not around yet. Our dues were next to nothing, but how were they paid? The gold standard was still in effect and we had \$5 Liberty Head gold coins minted 1795 through 1929.

From 1840 through 1907, a Liberty Head \$2.50 gold coin was used. If you were a member of San Francisco Lodge #3, you probably brought gold dust to pay your dues and weighed it. In 1849 the US Mint came out with a dollar coin. The problem was it was one-fourth smaller than today's Roosevelt dime and losing one was like losing a day's pay. The outcry was so huge that the mint had to retool and come out with a larger "Type III Princess dollar". One coin everyone had was the 3-cent coin which made its appearance in 1851 to facilitate the purchase of postage. No one trusted paper money, and even today gold is king.

### Around the lodge

In April, we began holding two meetings a month for general meetings and the house committee and officers will meet monthly. Everyone is invited. General meetings are held on the second and fourth Wednesdays, while the third Wednesday is slated for Officers, House, Calendar and Trustee's meetings.

No more ducking when parked under our eucalyptus trees. They have been trimmed back for your safety. Give Ben Reiger a hand for taking care of the grounds here at the lodge. All he needs is a gallon of gas about once a year for the lawn mower. Ben and other lodge members went to pick up oak that had fallen off trees on property off Kanan Road. They told the owner they would be back to pick up the rest. It was stacked very conveniently. Maybe too conveniently for when they returned, it was gone. Ben never gives up. At the

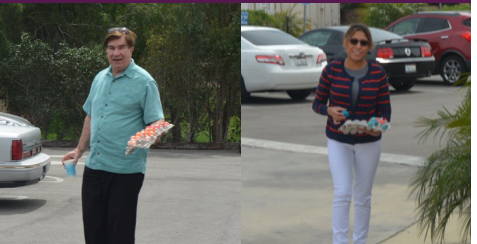

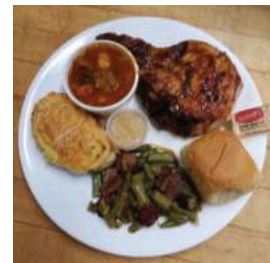
