ORIGIN OF FLAG DAY: In the United States, Flag Day is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The United States Army also celebrates their birthday on this date; Congress adopted "the American continental army" after reaching a consensus position in the Committee of the Whole on June 14, 1775. In 1916, the president of the United States issued a proclamation that officially established June 14th as Flag Day and in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.
