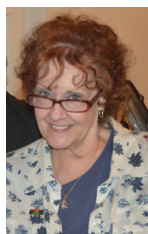

Leading Knight Dan Hoffman



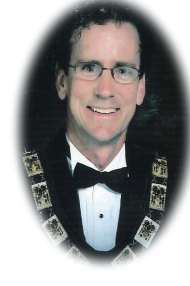
One of the Committees reporting to me this year is the Elks National Foundation (ENF). The mission of the ENF is to help Elks build stronger communities. The ENF fulfills this

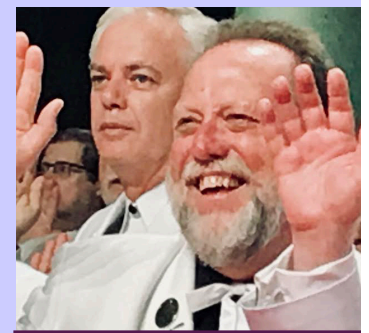

Terry's family moved to Thousand Oaks in the summer of 1959 when he was three years old and he has been here ever since.

After graduating from high school in 1974, Terry got into the construction industry, which was booming at the time. It seemed like half his graduating class did as well.

In May 1981, with his father as his sponsor, Terry became a member of Thousand Oaks Elks Lodge #2477, along with two of his brothers, Bart and Chuck. He quickly became involved as an officer and was elected as Secretary in 1984-85. In 1985-86, Thousand Oaks #2477 won the District Ritual competition, the first time for the lodge. He assisted the ritual team as the candidate and his father was Inner Guard.

Terry weaved his way through the appointed chairs while his kids were growing up. He also coached both Bryan

& Carol Ann's sport teams. Finally, he got serious in going through the chairs and became Exalted Ruler in 2009-10.

Terry is a past President of the T.O. Elks bowling league, and twice been the President of the 2477 PER Association, as well as other committees in his lodge. He is a member of the 2477 Veterans committee, very active in the Ventura County Stand Down for the homeless Veterans. He has been the WCCD Accounting Consultant Chairman and Officer Training Chairman.

As District Piggy Bank Chairmen, he helped rally the lodges to win the Leading Knights Challenge in 2010-13, and was recognized as "Outstanding District Chairman North, 2011-12 and 2012-13".

In 2013-14, Terry became District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in the West Central Coast District. He was blessed to come from a lodge that has some outstanding PDDGERS: Dr. Earl Pitman, Frank Rindone, Bob McKee, Gil Riding, Bill Lloyd, Richard Goldner and Greg Metzger.

His oldest son Steve became a member and now resides in Oregon. His youngest

son, Bryan, who lives in Columbus Georgia, was initiated by his Terry in February 2013 on PER Night. Terry also has a daughter, Carol Ann who lives in Annapolis Maryland with her Husband John who is a lieutenant in the Navy. His brother Bart is a member of Moreno Valley Lodge #2697 and his sister Ann is a member of Yucca Valley Lodge #2314, joining in 2013 while Terry was DDGER.

Terry's hobbies include softball, fishing, boating and hitting the little white ball into the trees (golf).

During his 38 years of being involved in Elkdom, Terry has always remembered the primary goals of the men who started his lodge and Elkdom in general. Elk lodges are a place to have fun with others while doing activities that benefit our community. He is proud to be a part of the BPOE. The **Best People On Earth!**

Terry is also proud to carry throughout the West Central Coast District the message of our new Grand Exalted Ruler, Michael T. Luhr. His motto is "Working Together to Make a Difference".
