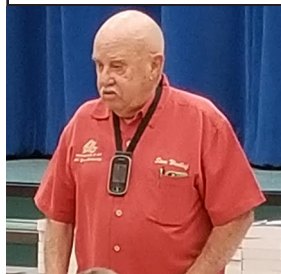

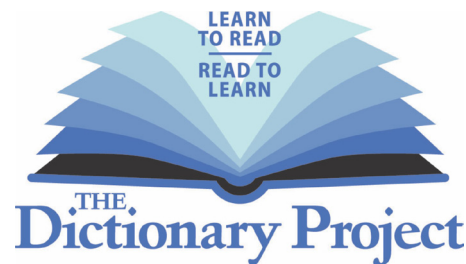

Creativity encouraged during Remembrance Month

In 1948 the Elks made a promise that “So long as there are Veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them.” This promise is as important today as it was on the day it was adopted.

Today the service provided through that promise has never been greater or needed more. Our Veterans who have sacrificed so much to protect our freedoms and allow us to live the American dream continue to need our help every day.

Traditionally, our Veterans Service efforts focused on veterans in VA facilities. It still represents a major part of our overall service efforts with many Elks volunteers in those facilities every day. Over the years, and with our nation's military involved at some level of conflict throughout the world, those service efforts have expanded to include our Army of Hope Program, which focuses on helping military personnel and their families, and our Welcome Home Program, which centers on service efforts to eliminate homelessness of those who previously served and those currently returning home.

These more recent programs, and even others that are yet to be defined, offer many opportunities to help veterans, military personnel, and their families outside of our traditional endeavors and in the local communities of our Lodges. Those opportunities include State-run facilities for veterans; homeless veterans housing facilities; homeless shelters that service veterans; stand downs; military bases; guard units; and other forms of assistance for those in need across all spectrums of the community. With that in mind, the month of November is our Veterans Remembrance Month. As we are all aware, within that month is Veterans Day on November 11.

This is a special day within a special month to give that extra measure of recognition and service to the veterans
