Thank you to everyone who, throughout the year, donated to the California-Hawaii Elks Major Project Inc. (CHEMPI) and the Elks National Foundation (ENF). CHEMPI and ENF are 501c (3) entities and

therefore checks written directly to them are tax deductible.

CHEMPI is our State Association providing children of families in need with occupational therapy, physical therapy, pre-school vision screening and speechlanguage therapy. This unique program funds 32 paid therapists and preschool vision screeners, hired by CHEMPI, to help disabled children when no other organizations can or will.

I remember when George Meehan, PER, reported to us that his granddaughter came home one day all excited and said, "the Elks were at our school today". She had her eyes checked. Our therapists drive thousands of miles every year.

The Elks National Foundation began with an initial \$100,000 grant. Only the interest earned on the ENF account is used, the principle is never touched. The Grand Exalted Ruler announces a per capita amount that he would like all Lodges to achieve. Last year it was \$4.75. With a membership of 450, our fundraising goal was \$2,137.50. Once we reach our goal we are able to request funds for programs in our community. Last year we received \$2,000 for the Ventura County Veterans Stand Down and \$1500.00 for our Drug Awareness Program. In earlier years we received funds for the Children's Carnival held at the lodge and Easter baskets for those who missed our Christmas Cheer program. Our Lodge does very well. We have generous members. The Elks also have the Welcome Home program where homeless Elks get a place to live but are in need of incidentals. We can apply for \$200 to cover these items and we did it 3 times last year. That's ENF and I've just scratched the surface.



Taken from the Elk's a Concise History

The Elks hold Veterans in high esteem. During the Grand Lodge convention held in Los Angeles in 1921, a proposal was made to establish the Elks National Headquarters in Chicago. The committee also recommended that the Order erect a memorial building honoring those who served their country and gave their lives during the Great War. 3.5 million dollars was raised by Elk lodges to pay for the new building. The cornerstone was laid in 1924 and dedicated to those who served in WW1 in 1926. It was rededicated in 1946 to those who saw service in WWII, then again in 1976 for those who answered the call in Korea and Vietnam. The Elks were among the first fraternal order to formally welcome home the returning Veterans from Operation Desert Storm. Lodges held appropriate functions recognizing the Veterans' sacrifices and thanking them for their commitment to duty. In 1994 the Memorial was remodeled and re-dedicated to peace and to those who served in Grenada, Panama and Operation Desert Storm.

Our story is long, our work is humble, our history is proud.
