Grand Lodge Budget

The Elks Grand Lodge has budgeted \$547,000 for the Elks drug awareness program. \$722,000 for the Elks National Veterans Service programs, \$585,000 to fund the "Elks" Hoop-Shoot contests and \$148,000 for the Elks soccer shoot. \$484,770 for maintenance of the Elks memorial building. The Elks will disperse more than \$14.8 million for scholarships, emergency grants for children of deceased or incapacitated elks, Legacy awards, Eagle Scout Scholarships and Girl Scout gold award scholarships. When you attend a Memorial service, Celebration of life or a funeral and the deceased was a Veteran, usually a flag is given to the spouse or next of kin. The military personnel practice the procedure of Flag folding. They take it very seriously. The Flag folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our great country was originally founded. The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue, containing the stars representing states our Veterans served in uniform. The canton field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted only when draped on the casket of a Veteran who has served our country honorably in uniform. In the United States Armed Forces, at the ceremony of retreat, the flag is lowered, folded in a triangle fold and kept under watch throughout the night as a tribute to our nations honored dead. The next morning it is brought out and at the ceremony of reveille, run aloft as a symbol of our belief in the resurrection of the body.

THE FOLDS

- 1st fold is the symbol of life.
- 2nd fold is our belief in eternal life.
- 3rd fold is in honor and remembrance.
- 4th fold is in God we trust.
- 5th fold is in tribute to our country.
- 6th fold is where our heart lies. We pledge allegiance to the Flag.
- 7th fold is a tribute to our armed forces.
- 8th fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death.
- 9th fold is a tribute to "Womanhood".
- 10th fold is a tribute to Father who has given their sons and daughters for the defense of our country.
- 11th fold is in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents King David, Solomon and the God of Abraham, Issac and Jacob.
- 12th fold represents eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars are in the uppermost, reminding us of or national motto, "In God we trust". After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it has the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under George Washington and the sailors and Marines who served under Capt. John Paul Jones.

The VA clarifies policy on Flag folding recitations in the "13-Fold" Ceremony. Other scripts approved to ensure burial services at the 125 National Cemeteries are operated by the Department of Veteran Affairs.
