#### Scholars Assist Green Non-profits on Service Trip

Each Elks Scholar Service Trip is a chance for scholars and alumni to travel to cities across the nation and learn, serve, and connect in the name of the Elks.

In March, the Spring Service Trip took the scholars and alumni to one of the "greenest" cities in the world—Portland, OR—so it's not a surprise that their green thumbs were tested.

The group worked with environmental organizations like Growing Gardens, a nonprofit that uses the experience of growing food in schools, backyards, and correctional facilities to cultivate healthy, equitable communities. The scholars landscaped a garden that will be used to teach hundreds of middle school students about the biology of plants and the importance of growing sustainable food.

"With these projects especially," said John Kavula, the Elks Scholar Fellow tasked with coordinating each service trip, "it was easy to take a step back at the end of the day and see how just a few hours of work made a huge difference in helping organizations continue their mission of caring for the world they live in."


The group collaborated with non-profits that help the city combat growing issues such as poverty, hunger, and homelessness. With Community of Hope, the group cleaned and painted a building that houses single-parent families experiencing homelessness. They left it feeling like a true home.

The week ended with a night at the Milwaukie-Portland, OR Lodge No. 142. They shared a meal, danced the night away, and toured the massive Lodge while making friends with dozens of Elks.

The Spring Service Trip was another week spent improving Elks communities, strengthening the Elks family, and showing Elks scholars and alumni the importance of altruism.

## Meet our 2019-2020 CHEMPI Theme Child Liam

Liam was born at Clovis Community Hospital after an uneventful pregnancy. However, just hours after birth Liam went into respiratory distress and was transferred to the neonatal intensive care unit at the hospital until his discharge home 8 days later. Fast forward a few months and Liam's parents began noticing that he was not meeting some typical developmental milestones such as controlling his head, rolling or crawling. Liam also began having seizures. It would be a long road of evaluations by different specialists until last May when Liam was diagnosed with a rare neurodevelopmental disorder due to a genetic gene mutation on the RHOBTB gene. This gene mutation had just recently been discovered in January 2018 and published in The American Journal of Human Genetics

Liam began physical therapy when he was six months old. Living in rural Mariposa County with limited resources Liam's family had to travel an hour each way to a clinic in Fresno so Liam could receive physical and occupational therapy. Liam's physical therapist at the time recognized

that this long travel time to get to therapy was very draining for Liam. This therapist referred Liam to The California-Hawaii Elks Major Project. If there was ever a child that needed and would benefit from in home therapy services it was Liam. The Elks stepped in and made this possible for Liam through all of their generous donations. Liam initially began occupational therapy with an emphasis on feeding and then began physical therapy when he was just over two years old with The Major Projects physical therapist, Lea Nibur.

When Lea first met Liam he was very limited physically. He could not control his head or even sit up on his own. Lea and Liam worked very hard in therapy focusing on strengthening, balance and floor mobility. Liam is now rolling, army crawling and he loves to play under his bed. During therapy sessions Liam is now able to sit, hold his head up and get into a hands and knees position, all with just a little help.

When physical therapy first started Liam

would tire very easily and become fussy quickly. Liam is now all smiles and laughs during therapy sessions. Liam communicates with facial expressions, hand gestures and even gives a thumbs up to let us know that he is happy. He signs "I love you" to his mother. Liam is surrounded by a very loving and supportive family. He enjoys spending time in his stander in the family room with his adoring grandparents. He also loves afternoon with his cousins who sing and play games with him after school. Even the mention of "the girls", Liam's cousins, puts a big smile on Liam's face. Liam has made very good gains in strength and endurance and has begun going to school for a few hours each week. His whole family is involved in therapy and help Liam practice his new skills. Liam delights us all with his quiet but mighty inner strength and determination. It has been a blessing for Liam to have in home therapy sessions through The California-Hawaii Elks Major Project.
