
## Thanks Visiting Member

and agencies of government, due to many laws, cannot assist us in any mode. Thousand Oaks churches are likewise restrained. Welcome to the new normal.



## A Message from Lodge Secretary, David Naccarato, PER

Elks History Charles Vivian, our founder, was involved with an order in England called the Buffalos. After arriving in New York to find fame and fortune (he was an entertainer) he asked around for a

gathering such as the Buffalos. He turned to the Masons. The Masons being made up of doctors, bankers and lawyers rejected Charles Vivian for he was a thespian. He was looking for a fraternal society. The word "fraternal" means befitting a brother. It is a society of men in brotherly union, mutual aid or benefit. Within the order before we had membership cards a password was used.

When members would come for a meeting or function there was a secret password to obtain entrance to what was called the "Temple". "Temple" was used by the Masons which the Elks changed to "lodge". Entrance was made into the anteroom.

Some famous passwords were "Hello Bill" and "Brother". This would not work in this day and age. Up until 1995 women were not allowed in the Elks. To give a shot in the arm for membership, Grand Lodge, trying to slow the drop in membership, allowed women to apply. In 1980 the order was at 1.5 million and times change. People had many choices of where to spend their time and money. Membership started to fall but charitable donations to Grand Lodge programs stayed the same or went higher. Most

lodges had a women's auxiliary and so it was an easy sell to allow women to join. Women members play a huge part in the lodge. Our first female Exalted Ruler was Sally Claunch. I was fortunate enough to act as her Leading Knight which made my year an easy one when I became Exalted Ruler. My slogan was W.W.S.D. which meant "what would Sally do". Sally's and my year were just about identical right down to the ER Christmas dinner which was prepared by Ed Bianchi. Sally was also the first female Elk of the Year. We have had Jill Williams as EOTY and this year it is Kathy Moye.

#### AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM YOUR SPONSORS

In recent times it has become apparent that an increasing number of our members are initially sending their questions, concerns and complaints directly to our Grand Exalted Ruler and/or Grand Secretary for response or action. It is understandable to want to get traction at the highest level possible, but the reality is that in almost every case these communications are just being sent back to the State Sponsors to deal with. With a lot of time being spent doing so. Then, typically, the Sponsors here in Area 7 will then refer the matter to the District Leaders in the local district for investigation and response. That takes more time, and will only result in the concern or complaint going to one of the places it should have gone originally, where local and specialized knowledge will be of benefit.

There is long tradition in Area 7 that for questions, problems or complaints the matter should first be taken up within the lodge, either with the officers or senior lodge leadership (PERs/PDDGERs). Beyond that the matter can be brought to the District Deputy, or if needed the District Leaders within the district. In states with a Special Deputy, if needed the matter can be taken up with him or her. Only then, and if needed, the matter can be sent to the Sponsors. There is no reason not to take advantage of these resources in proper order; going up the chain will produce the best answer in a more timely fashion and not consume valuable time needlessly on the part of our GER and Grand Secretary.
