Veterans

On the minds of the population are the 9/11 attacks. So many lost in a short time brought on by our enemies to our shores. What is being forgotten is another act "a day that will remain in infamy".

Those words were spoken by President Roosevelt who was an Elk member of Poughkeepsie New York Lodge # 275. After the attack **President** Roosevelt chose Admiral Nimitz to take over command of the Pacific Fleet. Most thought he looked more like a banker than the hell-for-leather leader we needed to take over. Nimitz asked how long he had, and the answer was till the "war was over". Admiral Nimitz arrived in Pearl Harbor on Christmas Day. After his tour of the destruction, he thanked his Lord for what could have been. On our money it states, "In God We Trust" and he didn't let us down. Admiral Nimitz pointed out the Japanese failures. 1st no second wave of bombers to destroy our dry docks. Ships that could be up righted and repaired at Pearl were and didn't need to be taken to San Diego. 2nd we had one and a half million barrels of fuel oil in above ground tanks.

(Underground bunkers were under construction but not yet finished) and the Japanese didn't touch a one. It would have taken years to replenish that fuel oil and it would have lengthened the war. 3rd, another mistake was they did not touch our submarine pens. Our subs sunk 75 percent of all Japanese shipping. **Admiral Nimitz** said he sweated everyday till that fuel oil was piped underground.

4th The last was be attacked on a Sunday morning where many sailors had stayed in town and not berthing aboard ship or if the attack came while in deep water the loss of life could have been 20,000+. The 3,800 was still a terrible loss. To the Japanese the battleship was the weapon of choice. We preferred the Aircraft Carrier and the battleship. Japanese ships maintained 22 Knots in the water while our ships averaged 18. Plus, without Panama Canal restraints the Japanese could build huge ships. We were restricted on width due to the Panama Canal. Thank you for your service. "As long as there are veterans the Elks will never forget them."

Rita's Fritatta Recipe

Many have asked for Rita's Italian frittata handed down for generations so here are the ingredients:

5 cups of all-purpose flour 3/4 cup of grated Parmesan or Romano cheese 1 pound of diced mozzarella cheese 2 pounds of cooked Italian sausage with skin jacket removed and cut up in pieces 5 bunches of scallions, 3 to 4 bunches of asparagus tips 6-9 eggs

Mix all dry ingredients together and then add 6 to 9 eggs and 2 ½ cups of water – add slowly. Thoroughly grease a large, large lasagna pan with olive oil. Pour mixture and bake for approximately 45 to 60 minutes at 375 degrees in electric oven and 400 degrees in gas oven. Check with a toothpick or fork to make sure it is cooked through. Yields 20 to 25 servings. Enjoy!
