I have donated it to the lodge so we have a tv for bingo, Orientation and Super Bowl.

We had our first *CYO* (cook your own steak) of the summer season and it was well attended. It was good to see a bunch of familiar and new smiling faces. Remember, CYO is the 4th Friday of the month until October. We are starting to see more Veterans and members for breakfast on Sunday mornings. We are having, in addition to the Kampers breakfast, 2 more breakfasts a month. Smitty is doing his N'Orleans style, and my son Bryan does the Vets breakfast. These are held on the second and third Sundays. Every third month, the Blue Star Moms of the Conejo Valley host one of Bryan's Vets Breakfast. FYI-The Blue Star moms are a group of moms who have sons or daughters who serve or have served honorably in the Armed Forces of the United States of America, and United States military personnel who serve or have served honorably and their families. Please come support them by having breakfast or donating to them directly. Our Veterans Fund helps sponsor the cost of the meal so that 100% of the proceeds of their breakfast goes to help them with their causes. Please support them.






From your Leading Knight



Elks History

Speaking about the **Grand Lodge Convention happening July 3rd through the 6th,** all Terry needs to do is hop aboard a Boeing 757 and he's there in Atlanta GA. in a few hours. In 1912 four Brookfield Mo. lodge #824 members who also worked together for the Burlington railroad walked 2,223 miles to get to the Grand Lodge convention held in Portland Oregon that year. C.B. Johnson, C.D. Stone, Herman Clark, and Fred Lyons were escorted to the edge of town by townsfolk



of Brookfield Mo. On their way west they visited 18 lodges where they were treated like royalty. They started at 7 am walked till 10 pm with only a canteen and averaged 25 miles a day. The railroad would drop off cards, letters, and food as they made their journey to the convention. Word spread of their journey and when they arrived in Portland, they were greeted by 2000 people all shouting as they stopped at the corner of 7th and Elm Street to enter the Elks Temple. They were to be carried the rest of the way, but the boys refused, "we're walking all the way to the registration desk".

The Grand Lodge convention was held in Los Angeles in 1909 and Los Angeles Lodge #99 was playing host to the convention that year. Now Lodge #99 sat atop Bunker Hill just outside the upper terminal head for the Angles Flight funicular railroad. The railroad took patrons from the Commercial district (literally downtown) up to Bunker hill for a penny. When the city leaders heard about the convention coming in a year the city leaders saw dollar signs. They knew for one tumultuous week, upwards of 2000 Elks and families would pour out of train depots to wander the streets of L.A, fill its hotels, restaurants and take-home countless souvenir plates, postcards, and pillows. (Pillows?) To show their gratitude for this windfall the city had its craftsmen cement in the letters B.P.O.E on the lower arch way to the Angles Flight funicular railway knowing each member wanting a ride up to lodge #99 will have to pay the toll. The letters BPOE are still inscribed on that arch, even though Lodge #99 was sold to the Moose lodge in 1927 and in 1968 was torn down all together. L.A. 99 merged with Santa Monica #906.

Make it a weekend adventure and ride the **Angles Flight Railway.** The shortest rail route on the west coast the other funicular railroads are in Cincinnati Ohio. It had been hit with neglect and disrepair and was dismantled and stored by the city and 27 years, later it was reborn, and it is all fixed now. One of our members came to me and asked why it had BPOE on the archway. I had no idea but research with Grand Lodge Archives gave up the story.
