Purple Pig is also another Charity. This one is State Association driven.

Every State Association has a Major Project. Ours is nicknamed the Purple Pig.

Up to the end of August we have donated \$6,758.50 which comes to \$15.86 per member donation. Are you part of the donation or is another member making up the slack?

The major Project was started back in 1950 as help for kids with cerebral Palsy. It is now for all disabled children who's parents are unable to provide or not getting the results that they feel are required. Our therapist have performed miracles. P.P .employs 35 therapist's ,handles a case load of about 700 kids that are seen on a weekly basis. The parents are taught how to continue therapy when not being visited by us .

So long as there are Veterans the Elk's will never forget them.

In the early weeks of WWII, The Elks war commission began an inventory of the personnel and recourses available to the order. Throughout Elkdom, as throughout America, there was wholehearted determination that America must survive.

In Ceremonies at the white house in January 1941, President Roosevelt mentioned the work of the Elks in National defense. He referred with pride to his own membership in Poughkeepsie, New York, Lodge no. 275

In 1942 , The war department asked the order to assist in recruiting 45,000 enlistees for Air Corps ground crews. In a few months, 97,000 skilled were brought into the Air Corps to the astonishment and delight of the Army Adjutant General.

The Navy, meanwhile, suddenly realized it was overlooking the Elks. The Secretary of the Navy, Frank Knox, wired the Elks for help with its own Naval Air Corps program. Again, the local lodges responded magnificently.

The Blue Star Mom's is a group of Mom's who have a son or Daughter who is serving in the military. They have a breakfast every quarter and can use your support. September 18th was a great breakfast.

August 22nd was the one year anniversary of the suicide bomber that killed 13 and wounded 2 of our service men and women. A Run/walk/ride fund raiser to help the families of these 15. Digital Artist Alan Golub and Annie Winston have teamed up with Non-Profit Organization 2949corp.com to create a 2023 memorial in the remembrance of the courageous fallen soldiers known as the Kabul 13. They sacrificed their lives defending freedom at the Kabul airport in Afghanistan August 26th 2021.. The son of the man who put the run together was called away for an errand on base just seconds before detonation of the bomb. His son survived but others did not. \$28,000 was raised that day for the families of the victims. Go to Kabul13.org for your calendar.

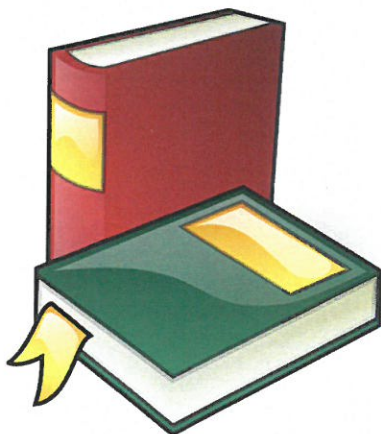

Our scholarship program is funded by the efforts of Rick Herrera and the members who bring in the bottles and cans with CRV redemption on them. On average its \$100 a week. This way Reem Agel can focus on receiving applicants that could use the help. Local lodge donates \$6,100. Applicants move up to District where they could receive more money, then State and national. National winners are eligible for up to \$60,000. Also off spring of Elk members can also apply for the Legacy scholarship or if they are disabled or going to a trade school scholarships are available for them also. Our members work to keep our doors open. One way is our weekly BBQ that's open to the public. Many of our members work more than one BBQ a week. With 426 members it should not be that way. Let me give you an idea of an average weekend BBQ, we serve;

254 Tri-Tip sandwiches

62 racks of baby back ribs

49 racks beef ribs

40 chicken halves

5 whole Tri-Tip roasts that we cut for the customer

5 cases soda

2 cases retail BBQ sauce

Box of chips (50)

No reason to burn out a willing member. If you have not put in a weekend come on down and see what it's like. You will have fun and time goes by fast.

Interaction with the public is a kick too. You will see the same customers every week and get to know what they want. They will have cash in hand and are a breeze to deal with. When we chose to charge tax instead of raising prices it took a week or two to get are regulars acclimated to the price with tax but not nary a negative word. Only negativity was from the members. 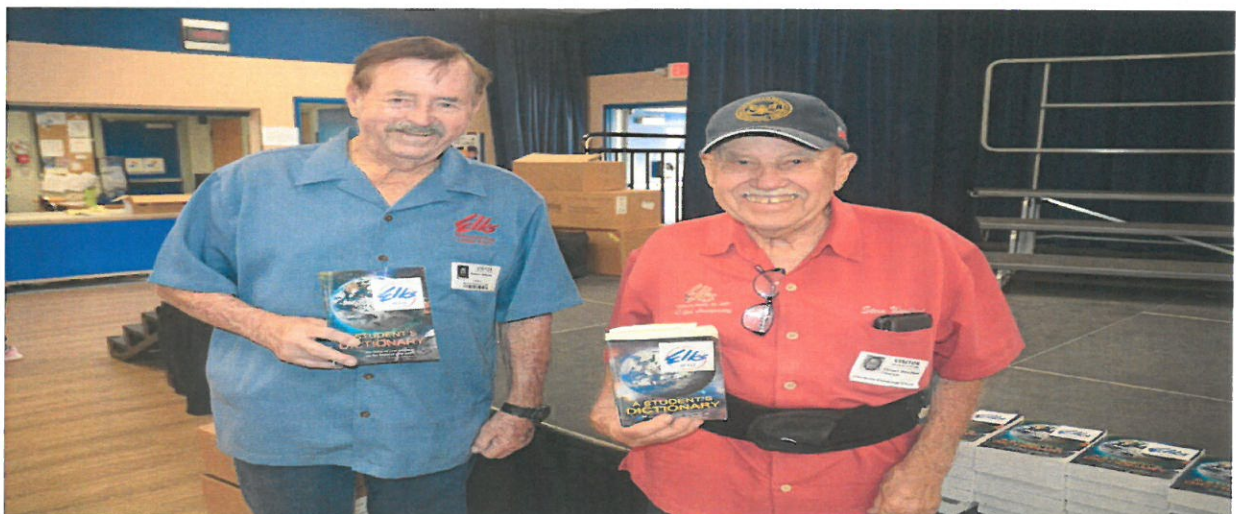

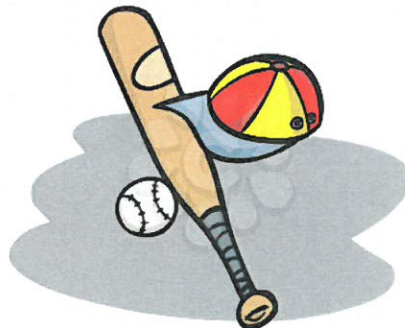
