The diaper dash for the James Store House.


Police and Firefighters appreciation night.

The easiest is the recurring donor for the Major Project/ Purple Pig. The form to become a recurring donor is in this Antler Antic's. Every State Association has their own major Project. It may be Boy's and Girls club or a food bank. Something along those lines. In 1950 the California/ Hawaii Elks Association started to take care of Children with disabilities. It was first cerebral palsy but soon changed to cover all forms of handicapped conditions. Kids from 6 months to 18 years of age are allowed to apply for this service. The Major Project even awards scholarships to the disabled. One child who has been on a vent her whole life graduated collage as a therapist. #### From the desk of the Secretary

I appreciate the early dues. We are a bit behind for we were waiting for the new key cards. They have been received and cards have gone out. To receive the coveted early bird sticker the dues need to be in by April 1st. The Grand Lodge assessment of \$35 is charged to every lodge for every member they have on the books weather the member pays they're dues or not.

I'd like to report on the BBQ. The BBQ is the one staple of this lodge that keeps us in the black. The BBQ covers things that the dues are not to cover. It takes the membership to give us a day for the BBQ. In May Conejo valley day's is 10 day's now. That's a big nut to crack. Waiting on more information to share with all of you. Either way that Saturday we'll have two BBQ's and we can't be in two places at once so it's all hands on deck.

Our average BBQ runs about \$5,500 to \$6,500 every week. We have had a couple of \$7,000 + Saturday's. The Trustee's allowed 5 rain outs for the budget they create every year, well we have blown past those so having CVD should put us back on track. Of course the working budget ends March 31st. The average BBQ sells 288 Tri-Tip sandwiches, 44 racks of baby back ribs, 24 half rack's, 35 single beef ribs and 20 racks of full beef,. 33 chicken half's, drinks, chips and sauce.

The 2023-2024 budget will be started so if you are a committee chairman you will need to submit how much money you will require the coming year and how you plan on raising that money. Get it in soon.

#### Elk history cont. from last month

Our ritual reads to strive diligently that The name of Elk as borne by you may be worthy of an American citizen— one who loves his fellow man.

Changing the name from the Jolly Corks to the Elk's did not happen overnight. Our founder Charles Vivian wanted the Buffalo's which is the organization he belonged to in England. The other Jolly corks wanted a fresh idea so they went to P.T Barnum's American Museum. There they found many stuffed animals and started to chose what they wanted to be called. Buffalo's was out, the beaver was to destructive, the fox to cunning but soon they came upon an Elk with it's rack of Antlers pointing to the sky. They learned that the Elk is strong of limb, fleet of foot. It's perception is quick and Keen and the animal is quick to protect it's own.

The vote was 14-1 for the Elk.

Now a bit about P.T. Barnum, The museum was located at Broadway and Ann Street. It burned down in 1865. It was quickly rebuilt further up Broadway but it to burned down in 1868. Instead of rebuilding, Barnum took his show on the road and joined up with Baily and were forever known as the Barnum and Baily circus. Fortunately, the Jolly Corks were able to view an Elk on display in 1867.
