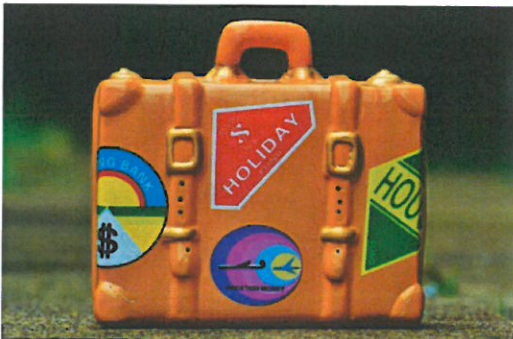

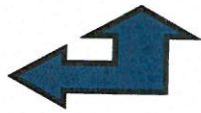
Happy Father's Day

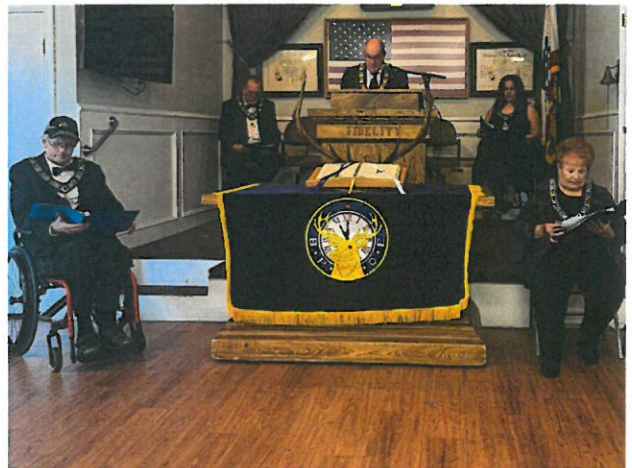
Mothers Day May 14th 2023

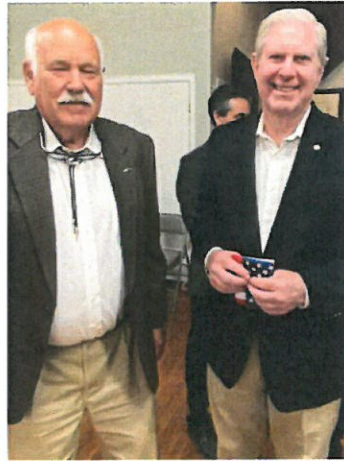
It tells me that should I ever be overtaken by adversity, the hand of every Elk in all the world will be stretched forth to assist me in my necessities.

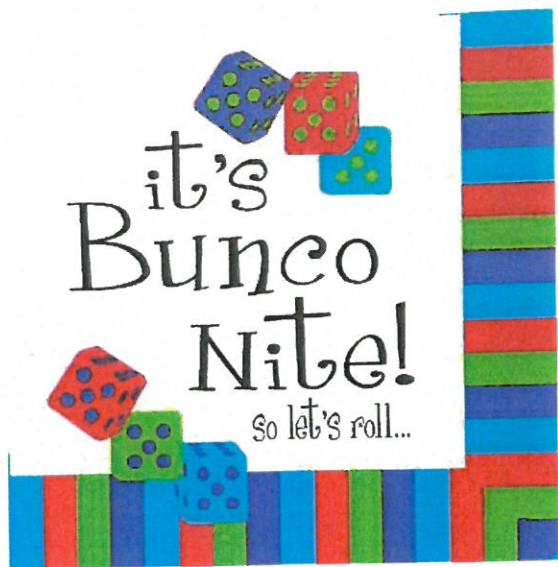
The contest presents good competition against the other lodges in our district. It brings us all closer as officers as we travel the district and visit each others lodges.

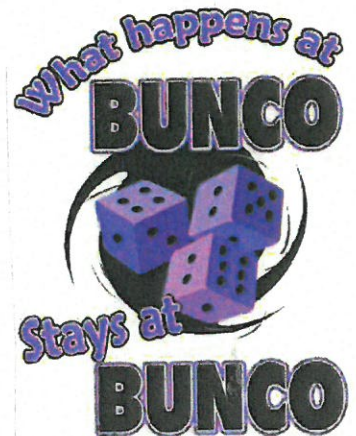
