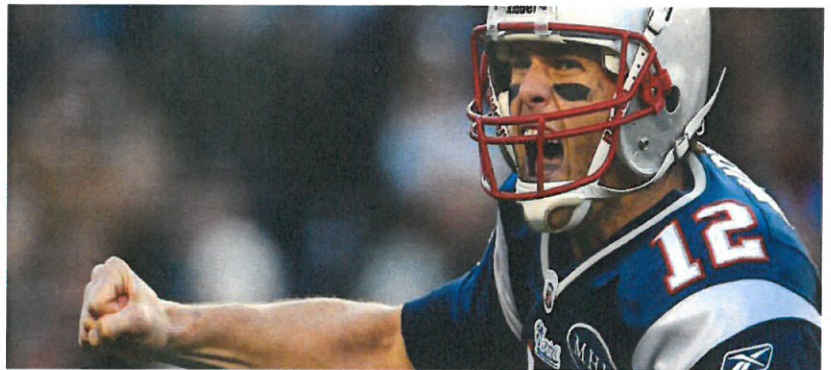

James Store House 501© 3

James Store House was brought to our attention by Trustee Reem Agel. Many of our scholarship applicants often volunteer. Reem has met and in fact a recent scholarship recipient Finely Shinnick is a volunteer there.

James Storehouse is a nonprofit organization that serves children from the crib to college. They serve kids presently in foster care.

On average, they reach 1,345 children and families each month. In 2022 they provided 16,151 appointments and deliveries for babies, children, youth and their caregiving families in Ventura and Los Angeles County.

Opened in 2014, they have grown exponentially. Community involvement has rallied in beautiful ways to help care for our most vulnerable children. Like the Elks, they are able to support the community solely through donations.

This support has caused a 41% decrease over the past two years of children entering foster care in Ventura County. On their 18th birthday, children in foster care age out of the system: 20% become immediately homeless and still need help.

Currently 700 kids are in foster care in Ventura County and 35,000 in LA county.

They strive to break the multi-generational cycle of abuse, neglect and poverty.

James Storehouse also provides a safe environment for parental visitations.

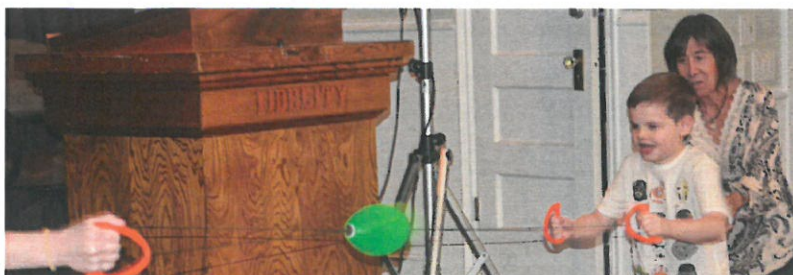

The G.O.A.T. Tom Brady

Thomas Edward Patrick Brady Jr. grew up in San Mateo California. He Attended Serra High School and was a dual sport student. In fact, Tom was Recruited by the Expos as a catcher, but Tom liked Football more. When he joined the football team, the team had never won a game or scored a touchdown. In his senior year as a starter Brady went 10 and 0 and impressed his coach so much that the coach made a recruitment Video for him and sent it out to colleges. The Amazing Blue, Michigan Wolverines came a calling in the spring but by the time he got there in the fall the coach that had recruited him had been fired and Drew Henson a local boy who was also going for the quarter back Position had arrived. Brady had to share playing time with him. If Drew didn't get playing time he was going to play baseball. The football program brought in a lot of money for the school and Drew was their guy, so Brady had to prove himself. Drew would get the team in a hole and Brady was always sent in to get them out. Brady's record at Michigan was 25 and 5. He took them to the Orange Bowl in 2000 where they beat Alabama by one point. In the 2000 draft he thought maybe 2nd round but it went all the way to the 199th pick in the 6th round when the Patriots picked him up and he was 4th in the dept chart.

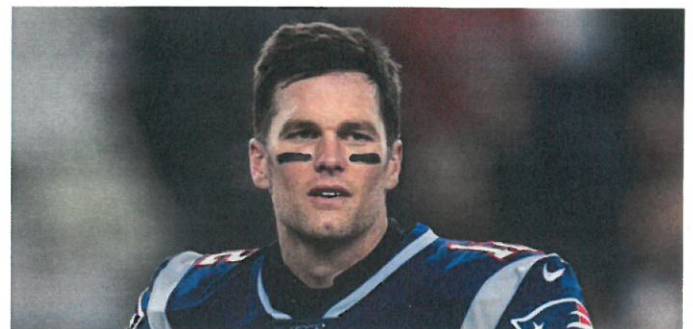
The 2000 Patriot roster had a huge rookie class and the way Tom worked with the other rookies impressed Bill Belichick and he was moved to back up for Drew Bledsoe. 2001 week two, against the Jets Drew Bledsoe was nailed by Moe Lewis and broke a rib that punctured his lung and was out of the game for half a year. Brady took over and lead them to Super bowl 36 and won. First bowl win in 42 years, 27 since Robert Kraft owned the team. In 2002 the Oakland Athletics won 20 games in a row. In 2003 the Patriots lost to the Bills on October 5th. Their next loss came on Halloween 2004. 21 wins in a row, a record that will last forever. Back to back titles 2003 and 2004.

Tom Brady took the Patriots to 6 Super Bowl titles, one more with the Buccaneer's. His total passing yards is 100,374 or 57 miles. 649 touchdown passes. Tom Brady holds 17 quarter back records. After free agency he went to the worst winning Percentage team of all sports (Buccaneers) and took them to the Super bowl and won during covid with no pre season.

In his six wins with the Patriots, he never scored in the first quarter and always was behind and came back to win in the 4th quarter. 45 4th qtr comebacks total. In Super Bowl 55 with 40 seconds left. He scored with a pass to Rob Gronkowski to Score in the first quarter for the first time.

In Super Bowl 49 against the Seahawks at half time they were down by 10 points. No team had ever come back by such a deficit in the 3rd qtr, but Brady proved them all wrong and beat the Seahawks. Then Superbowl 51 against the Falcons at half time the patriots were down 21-3. In the 3rd qtr the Falcon's came out and scored again making it 28-3. With 3:87 left in the 3rd Qtr, Brady turned on the charm and again came back from a 25 point deficit and beat the Falcons 34-28. Superbowl 53 against the Rams was the lowest scoring Superbowl. Tom Brady beat the Saint Louis Rams in Superbowl 36 and the Los Angeles Rams in Superbowl 53.

The Buccaneers were the first to host a Superbowl in their own stadium. Superbowl locations are chosen 5 years in advance, letting venues and cities apply for hosting. Superbowl 55 was to be played at So-Fi Stadium but it was not finished so the next in line was Raymond James Stadium in Superbowl 56. They were moved up one year. 2002 was the only year as a starter that Tom Brady did not make the play offs. The team that did win the Superbowl was the Tampa bay Buccaneers. Weird. Before you all fact check me Tom Brady was hurt in 2008 in the first game of the season and was out for the year. Didn't go to the play offs then either. First overtime game in Superbowl came in Superbowl 51. Brady was there.
