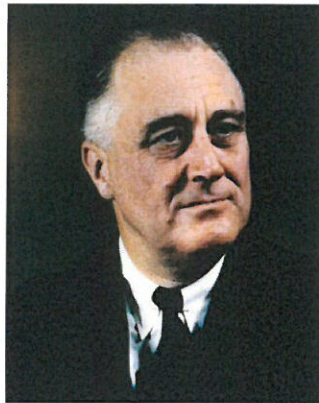

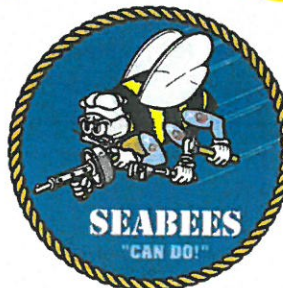
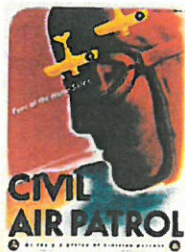

It was a full day of loading up at the lodge, setting up at the fair, preparing the BBQ menu items we were serving and 7 hours later did it all again in reverse.

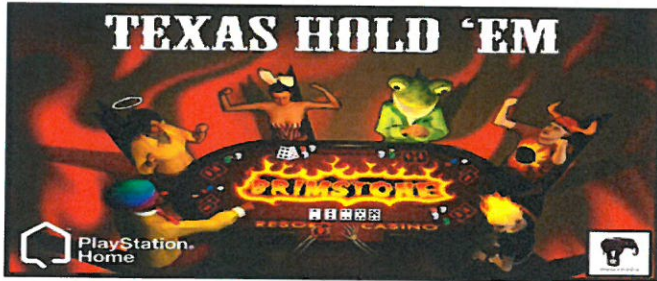

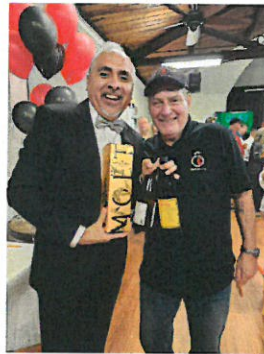
