



Now to the fun things that will be going on at the lodge this month.





The Thousand Oaks Elks Lodge is here to inculcate the principles of our order-Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and fidelity. To recognize a belief in God; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its members.

With that being said, we are a business also. The lodge has membership dues, while this is a good source of net-net dollars the dues must cover costs of statements, membership cards, key cards, postage, the cost of the Ritual team, State, Mid-Term and Grand lodge conventions, cost of printing and mailing of the lodge newsletter, plus the cost of the lodge office and staff. There is little chance that any surplus funds will be available from the membership dues.

(one question that is asked at the end of every Lodge year is:)

<u>Did the membership dues actually cover the costs</u> <u>of these budgeted items?</u> Dues are not used to pay costs of other lodge functions. They must earn income to cover the costs or by other methods. All dinners and food programs should have a food cost of 30 -35 %.

Unfortunately, it's been much higher. That's when the house committee that includes the 4 chair officers and the trustee's may implement a procedure to make sure we are in the black and not treading water. A \$12 dollar Friday night dinner with food costs of 35%, still needs to figure in Bar staffing, Edison, Gas Co., janitorial, Spectrum. Same bills you all have at home.

The actual lodge dues have not been raised but many lodges have raised theirs's. You know prices are higher and the lodge is in the same boat. Coming down for a dinner, a taco, burger or even a drink with friends it all helps.

All members are invited to a House Committee meeting. Your idea's are warranted. We need to hear from you.

Lodge dues \$128.00 + Elks liability ins. \$40= \$168.00
